John K. Trocke, chairman of the U. S. D. A. Council, will speak on "Introduction to the Problems Confronting Agriculture in Oakland County." A talk will be given by Roger O'berg, vocational agriculture teacher, describing the various agricultural agencies and their duties.

Following the talks, the audience will be divided into small groups to discuss individual problems of the agencies and make recommendations for solving them.
