Keeping Original Mortgage After Payoff Suggested For Assurance

If you're like me, the mortgage on your home isn't paid off yet, but when it is, you'll keep the original as a safety measure. It's a great day when you finally make the last payment on your home, or when your church or lodge owns its building free and clear. I can't speak from experience yet, as far as my home is concerned, but I did take the other day in a ceremony at our neighborhood church when we "burned the mortgage."

The church trustees are pretty smart businessmen, however, and noted that the piece of paper they touched a match to was a photostatic copy. They saved the original note and mortgage as a precaution, and that's just what I'm going to do when I get the written notice of discharge on my own mortgage.

I've found out that your note and mortgage are valuable papers, even after payment, and should be treated as such. It's best to keep the originals in case there ever should be a question of non-payment or other irregularities. The written "discharge of the mortgage" to which you are entitled also should be recorded promptly with your Register of Deeds, so the official records will show that the mortgage lien against your property has been wiped out. A just locking the discharge in a safe place doesn't change the official title record at the Court House.

You see, while legally a mortgage becomes inoperative the moment the debt is paid, the public records still indicate. A mortgage is evidence that you as a borrower have given a lien on your property as security to the person or lending institution who loaned money to you. The lender in almost every case records and files your mortgage with the Register of Deeds so that prospective buyers or lenders, or any others who subsequently loan you money, will have notice of the lien. It is important that this record be cleared of the lien.

There is always a possibility that a future question might arise on the title of the property, and the original papers may be very helpful to you as evidence. It would be a rare case, but there could even be the necessity of paying a second time if the note and mortgage had been destroyed, and you had not proof of payments. On occasion income tax authorities question deductions for interest after you have disposed of real estate or satisfied the mortgage. If you have your copy of the note, with interest payments endorsed on it, this usually is accepted as satisfactory proof. When that great day comes and

ated at \$507.15. However, the payments could be made on a 10, or 15 year basis. The Council approved a motion to hold a public hearing on the proposed Monday, April 16, at 8:00 p.m. in the Municipal Court Room, 23616 Liberty Street. A request was received from Jack Reinkens, 33456 Alta Loma, asking the Council to consider the extension of sidewalk along the north side of Alta Loma to Farmington Road and north on Farmington Road to the Post Office. The City Manager was directed to make a study of the situation in this area as well as along Liberty and State Streets and to make a report at the next meeting. A study will also be made of the drainage situation on the east side of Gill Road as requested by E. S. Mather.

Carl Shaw, 31831 Valleyview, appeared before the Council seeking action on the elimination of a drainage problem adjacent to his property. The City Manager was directed to have a survey made of the situation and have a report ready by the next meeting. A letter was received from the Oakland County Civil Defense Director announcing the appointment of George Cole as Deputy Director for the City and Township.

Following a discussion on the current problem of getting the City Planning Commission members more active, Councilman James Cavanaugh suggested that the City Clerk contact each member of the Commission asking if they still wish to serve or if they could suggest a date that would be more convenient for the regular meetings.
