hundreds of thousands of gallons of kerosene, and he's moving at an average speed of 50 miles an hour. To transport the kerosene a hundred miles takes two hours. And what wages do the American railroad workers receive in comparison to the Chinese coolies? The American gets a minimum of \$10 a day, an average of \$15 a day.

The freight rate on the American railroad is less than a cent per gallon per hundred miles, instead of ten cents as in China. What's the difference? It is the polis. The coolie has a 10-cent investment and he makes 10 cents a day. The tool investment in America for each railroad employee is \$20,000. That is the difference.

The American system, with its private ownership principle, its profit incentive, its competitive dynamo, justify big investment in industrial tools. And we should never forget what this big tool investment means in better jobs, better products, a higher living standard for all.

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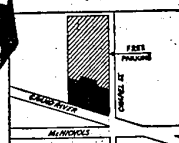
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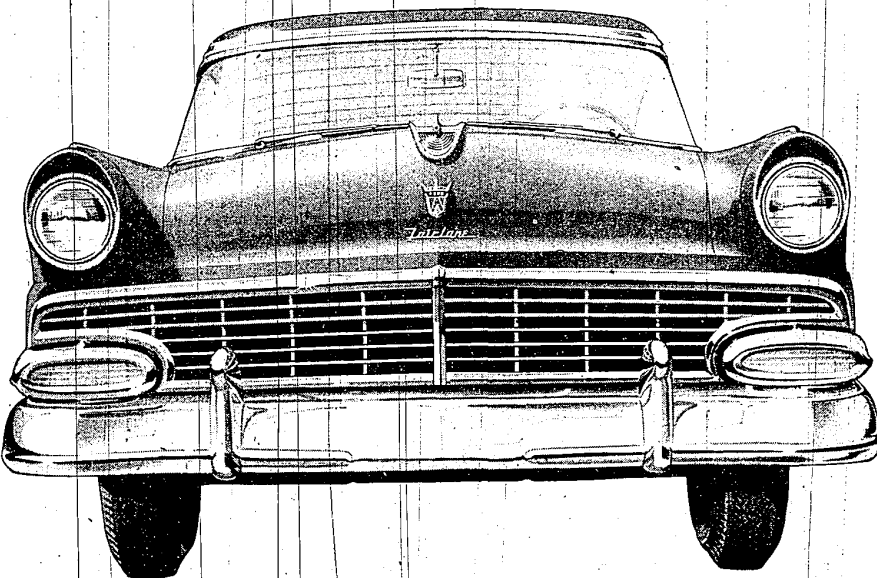
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
