**Elks Name New National Head**

Fred L. Bohn of Zanesville, Ohio, was elected Grand Exalted Ruler of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks at the Order's 92nd Grand Lodge Convention in Chicago on Monday, July 9.

Local Elks in attendance at the convention were Exalted Ruler Pat Buttermore and his wife and Alfred N. Tillin and his wife.

Mr. Bohn, 54 years old, is a partner in a plumbing and heating and supply firm. He was editor of the Zanesville "Signal" from 1928 to 1938. The fifth Ohioian to head the Elks since the Order was founded in 1868, Mr. Bohn formerly was chairman of the Grand Lodge's board of trustees and has held other high posts in the Order, in which he has been active since 1925.

Mr. Walker, the retiring Grand Exalted Ruler, reported to the convention delegates that the Order's membership gains and losses last year extended a record of uninterrupted growth since 1939. He said that the membership as of April 1 stood at the all-time high of 1,774,494, a gain of 20,818. Thirty-eight new lodges were organized during the year to bring the total to 1,762.

al area around this site to warrant the construction of a school building. O. E. Duncle, superintendent of schools, stated that it is the policy of the Board to locate buildings where the students are in an effort to reduce transportation problems and expense. The Superintendent added that a great many students living in the City must now be transported to the Ten Mile School because of the hazards of Grand River and McGee Hill on North Farmington Road. Duncle pointed out that since most of these students live within one mile of the school, no state reimbursement is received. Farley Thomson, former member of the School Board, pointed out that location of a grade school in the proposed area would greatly relieve transportation costs. He stated that transportation of city children to the Ten Mile School is costing city property owners about \$3,000 per year in extra tax, since this money is not reimbursable from the State. He suggested that the Council consider this matter in relation to the amount of tax benefit which would be received from the development of the city site.

Lindbert stated that it is not the contention to have these children transported to there may be other sites available in the area. The Board members were asked whether or not consideration had been given to the property on the east side of Farmington Road north of the Cut-Off. Tupper stated that this specific property had not been considered, however owners of other parcels in the general area have been approached without success.

Councilman James Cavanaugh questioned the advisability of use of this land for a school site because of its odd shape and its location in the center of the one large tract of land still remaining in the city. Councilman V. O. Bates stated that the Council is anxious to work with the Board in the solving of this problem; but that he too questioned the location of the site. Tupper added that the Board has no particular designs on this specific piece of property. He stated that if another site would be located in the same general area, it would serve the purpose.

and returned to the tax rolls. The Council authorized the Manager to proceed with the securing of bids for the property. All of the Councilmen approved the motion with the exception of James Cavanaugh.

Final approval was given to an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance establishing limits on the number and size of gasoline service tanks at gas stations. The amendment provides for not more than three 4,000 gallon tanks and one 1,000 gallon tank. Councilman Paul Calkins suggested that a provision be added to the ordinance requiring that concrete slabs be installed over the tanks to eliminate possible floating. The original amendment was approved with Calkins casting the only negative vote.

At the suggestion of Mayor Robert Lindbert, the Council expressed unanimous appreciation for the excellent job being done by City Manager Earl Scherffus.




