Men of professional stature mark Governor Williams' choices for controller. Avoiding candidates with close political or party ties, he turned to Michigan's universities to make selections three times.

Dr. Miller, state controller for the past 18 months, is presently on leave from Michigan State University. His two predecessors are Robert F. Steadman of Wayne University and John W. Lederle from the University of Michigan.

The first controller, John A. Perkins, also from the U-M, was appointed by former Governor Sigler and served three months before Governor Williams took office.

Proof that a professor can handle the complex administrative tasks demanded of a state controller is demonstrated by every one.

Dr. Miller says, "I'm not an expert on any particular division assigned to our department. I have capable men handling each division. But, I believe a liberal arts training provides the best background for service in the executive capacity controlling the overall actions of the department."

No career politician, Dr. Miller does not intend to continue as a political or governmental employee when his present work is concluded.

"My training and background are welded to an academic career," he comments.

At Michigan State he was a full professor in the political science department until 1954 when he assumed the administrative role as head of the Department of Teacher Education.

As an expert on state government, he is co-author of a book "State Administrative Reorganization," and has contributed articles to the American Political Science Review, Agricultural History and many other publications.

State Primary Voting To Be Down From 1952 Total, Authorities Predict

About one-third of the total electorate is expected to go to the polls Tuesday, August 7, in Michigan's Primary election to pick the Republican and Democrat nominees for governor, lieutenant governor, and various congressional, state legislative and county offices.

Unusual harvest conditions, unemployment in Detroit, late vacations and a general apathy will tend to keep the state-wide voter turnout down to about 1,000,000 votes, quite a decline from the record 1952 Presidential year total of 1,436,000.

There were 3,128,564 voters registered in Michigan when the first state-wide tabulation was made last April by the State Director of Elections. The total was increased slightly before the Primary registration deadline in July, but no one knows exactly how much. Registration officials in most parts of the state said interest was at a low point, which indicates that the gain wasn't appreciable.

The Republican gubernatorial race between Mayor Albert E. Cobo and Donald S. Leonard, GOP nominee in 1954, is the only contest at the top state level. Clarence Reid, former lieutenant governor, who is seeking the GOP nomination again, is without opposition. On the Democrat side, Governor G. Mennen Williams and Lieutenant Governor Phil Hart are unopposed.

Aiding and abetting the interest lack is the Cobo-Leonard fray. Cobo isn't too well known in out-state Michigan, while Leonard didn't have the funds to put on a good race. Cobo has the strong support of many top Republicans plus financial backing. He is expected to win.

Congressional races have attracted some interest, as have battles for state representative and state senator nominations. In the county level races, the Democrats have served notice they'll be putting up a battle in the November election by filing for many county level offices. Few Republicans have opposition for nomination.
