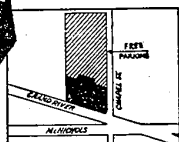

A total of 534 boys were entered in this year's derby. Reckling stated that tentative plans are being formulated for next year's race with the hopes of doubling the number of entrants.

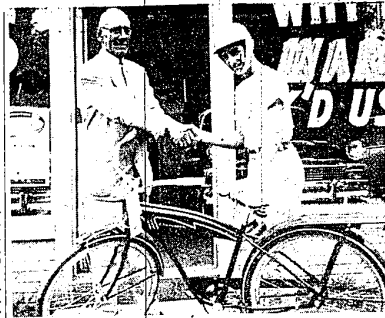

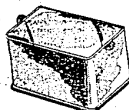
