The southwest corner of the Township will remain commercial as approved by the Board. The site located in Section 30, is proposed for development as a race track and recreation center. The proposal is appearing on the August 7 ballot in response to the filing of referendum petitions requesting a vote on the issue. All qualified electors of the Township are eligible to vote on the proposal. A special election will also be held on August 7 regarding whether or not Section 12 in the northeast area of the Township shall be incorporated as a village. Only the qualified electors of Section 12 will vote on the question. In addition to the actual proposal, the electors will name five members to the proposed Charter Commission. The candidates are: Alger M. Clark, Herman A. Dobson, Vernon P. Fisher, Fred M. Missal and P. G. Schlotterbeck. If the voters approve the incorporation proposal, the Commission will become active. The boundaries of the proposed village of Woods are: Twelve Mile Road, Middlebelt Road, Thirteen Mile Road and Inkster Road.

**Clarkson Seeks Legislative Seat**

St. James Clarkson is a candidate for the State Legislature in the Fourth District on the Democratic ticket. The district covers the townships of Novi, Lyon, Farmington and Southfield, and the cities of Berkley and Oak Park in Oakland County.

Clarkson is an attorney in private practice and is 31 years of age. He resides at 23525 Valley View, Southfield Township, with his wife and two sons.

Clarkson received his college education at Highland Park Junior College; Northwestern University in Boston, Massachusetts; and at the Detroit Institute of Technology. He received his Law Degree from the Detroit College of Law in 1951.

Mr. Clarkson served in General Patton's Third Army in World War II, receiving the American Theater Ribbon, the European Theater Ribbon with four battle stars (Good Conduct Medal, Victory Medal, Combat Infantryman's Badge and the Silver Star Medal. A member of the State Bar of Michigan, he is serving in its Taxation and Grievances Committees. He also is a member of the Southwestern Political Club, the National Association of Claimants' Compensation Attorneys, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and Post Advocate of the Dunham-Ray, Southfield Post, and a member of the Sigma Nu Phi legal fraternity.

A candidate in 1952 for State Representative, he was given a qualified rating by the Detroit Citizens League and was endorsed by many organizations.

Mr. Clarkson favors more State Aid for the mentally ill and State support of the St. Lawrence Seaway to insure Michigan deep water ports to enhance free trade and prosperity in Michigan. He is against any form of State income tax.

architectural negotiations are being made, thus making available four additional classrooms at the Junior High School now being used by school administrative personnel.

A report by Trustee Douglas Hammill indicated that he and other members of the Board had made a study of reported sanitary conditions at the German School and found them to exist. He stated that all members were in accord that the school should be closed as soon as possible and new kindergarten classroom space be provided for youngsters elsewhere.

Since such a move was deemed impossible for the next school year, it was recommended that every possible improvement be made in sanitary conditions there, but that funds not be expended for costly permanent improvements. The Board authorized the installation of smaller toilet seats as well as vents in both the lavatory and pump rooms. Replacing of the lavatory and pump room and chimney improvements were also authorized.

A report on school sites indicated that final negotiations are being completed on sites already purchased or authorized for purchase. It was revealed, however, that efforts remain the element to obtain a site in the City of Farmington south of Grand River Avenue.

Superintendent O. E. Dunckel pointed out that the Board should begin immediately to acquire additional school sites. He stated that more elementary classrooms will be needed before the elementary schools to be constructed this year are completed.

In other action taken by the Board, completion of transactions in the phase of the elementary school buses was authorized and the National Bank of Detroit was named as paying agent on the 1956 Bond Issue. A proposal for the erection of lights around all elementary school buildings in the District was tabled for further study. Some members of the Board indicated that they felt such a project would be too costly for the amount of benefit derived.




since 1950, Farmington Township ranked seventh with its addition of 2,095.
