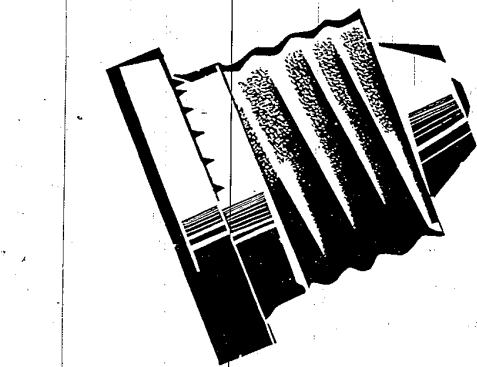

Conservation law convicts reported during the last week listed 104 violators. Justices throughout the state assessed fines totaling \$742 and court costs totaling \$813.

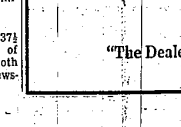
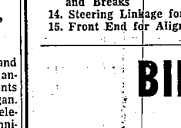
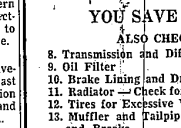
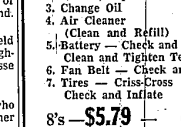
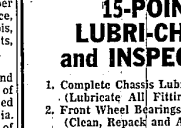
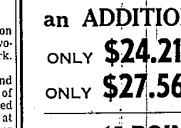
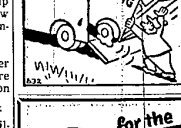
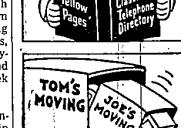
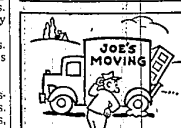
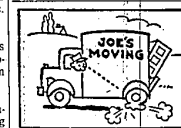
Two Gaylord residents received 30-day jail sentences for transporting firearms in a game area between sunset and sunrise. The men were convicted in a Gaylord justice court.
