You and your wife own property jointly, never guessing that for some people such ownership is unwise.

I've learned from chatting with neighbors and friends that most married couples share ownership in some property — usually their home.

We say we "own it jointly." It's technically described as "tenancy by the entireties." This legal jargon means a joint ownership by husband and wife in such a way that if either one dies, his or her interest automatically goes to the survivor.

Such ownership has become very popular, and a fellow that sells real estate told me that it's the way most homes have been bought in the big housing boom we've been going through the past 10 years.

Most of my friends say they hold their property this way because "it's the same as a will," or "it saves taxes" if one of them dies. Most of them have an idea they're going to save the survivor some trouble or money in settling the estate when death comes to one of them.

It sounds simple, but in reality it can be very complicated. One young couple in our neighborhood owned a nice little home "jointly." They had two children. Then the husband died suddenly. Mary, the wife, "automatically" became the owner of the house. Later, she married again. When Mary and her new husband borrowed money to build a sunporch, she added his name to the title as joint owner.

Soon after that, Mary was killed in an auto accident, which left the house entirely in the hands of her second husband.

This fellow was transferred to another city, and he sold the house at \$16,000. That money was all his and none of it belonged to Mary or two children.

I guess joint ownership is fine for many people, but it has so many advantages and disadvantages that its use has to be judged on individual circumstances. If a member of one party can't back out of a joint ownership on his own desire, so in case of disagreement or domestic trouble between joint owners there could be great difficulty. With the frequent changes in state and federal tax laws and the constant changes in family circumstances, this can be an important matter to you.
