Game Hunting Fees To Stay Same This Fall

All license fees for Michigan's 1956 hunting seasons remain unchanged from last year. Proposed increases in fees would not affect licenses for the upcoming hunting seasons or the 1957 fishing seasons.

The state Conservation Commission voted at its June meeting to ask the legislature to boost license fees to meet rising costs of operation. If the legislature approves the proposed increases early in 1957, the new fees would be in effect on hunting licenses in fall, 1957, and on fishing licenses December 1, 1957, when the 1958 fishing permits go on sale.

Resident license fees for the upcoming hunting seasons are: small game, \$3; deer and bear, \$25.50; and camp permit for deer, \$3.50. These fees apply to firearm or archery licenses.

Nonresident hunting fees are: small game, \$15; deer and bear, (firearm), \$35; and deer and bear (archery), \$10.

RULES ON CHILD ADOPTION TERMED EXTREMELY STIFF

For every seven couples who want to adopt a baby, adoption agencies have only one child available, say the editors of a leading national magazine.

This situation has caused the agencies to set up stiff requirements in placing children in "ideal" homes.

Almost unanimously, agencies want couples under 40 who can prove that they can never have children. Those with chronic physical defects are considered bad risks. Most states provide by law that children of one race cannot be placed with parents of another and some courts have held that babies must be placed with families of their own religion. Financial stability is more important than wealth, but adopting parents must be able to provide a child's room of his own.

Some procedures for matching a child and prospective parents include: holding up placement of a brown-eyed child until brown-eyed parents are found; looking at a youngster with an eye to what his mother and father might have achieved educationally had their circumstances been different.

Old rules dictated that college-bred couples could not have a child of ill-educated parents.

NEW BOOKLET ON HEART EXAMINATIONS NOW AVAILABLE FROM DETROIT OFFICE

A heart examination is a "painless procedure" with "nothing mysterious about it" according to the illustrated booklet, "How The Doctor Examines Your Heart," issued in Michigan by the Michigan Heart Association, a member of the Michigan United Fund. That it can also be a life and health-saving procedure is made clear by the booklet which observes:

"It is now possible to discover many heart ailments accurately and early. The earlier heart and blood vessel diseases are discovered, the more effective will be the treatment."

While the techniques employed in a heart examination vary from case to case, in all of them the doctor employs his five senses, sharpened by clinical experience and aided when necessary by instruments such as the stethoscope, fluoroscope, sphygmomanometer and electrocardiogram.

What is a complete heart examination? This will vary, but the doctor studies with the age, physical condition and health background of the patient. For this reason, the first step in examining the heart is usually the taking of a complete health history, one which will bring to light past illnesses, family health patterns and

Hunting In State Appeals To All Ages

With the stethoscope, the physician listens to the sounds made by the opening and closing of the heart valves to determine whether they are functioning normally. The doctor also directs a light into the eyes for a close-up examination of the blood vessels in the retina, since these tiny, but clearly visible, blood vessels often give clues to the condition of the entire circulatory system.

When additional information is needed on the site and shape of the heart, the doctor may turn to the fluoroscope, a type of x-ray which projects an instantaneous picture of the chest cavity onto a screen. Since the beating heart produces minute but measurable electrical impulses, the electrocardiogram (an instrument which picks up these impulses, magnifies them and records them on a graph)
