Italian Exchange Student Begins
Year's Study Here, Enrolled At C.H.S.

Exchange student Elda Dossela, 17, of Milan, Italy, arrived here last week on the foreign exchange student program to begin a year-long stay as a guest of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Bailey and family of St. Francis Street.

She is one of a group of 38 from Italy and nearly 600 other foreign students from all parts of the world who arrived in New York August 18 on the exchange program. The students have been disbursed to all parts of the United States to take up year-long residence with American families.

Miss Dossela, who arrived here Monday, August 20, is enrolled as a senior student at Clareville High School and is becoming acquainted with the American way of life prior to the opening of classes next week. She will take courses in English, American History, American economics, algebra and physics. She will be graduated along with other seniors at the school in June of 1957.

Following her return to Milan in the summer, Elda plans to enroll at Milan University, where she will begin preparatory courses in the physician profession. Miss Dossela is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Francesco Dossela and has one brother, Dolio, 14. Her father is in the importing and boat building business in Milan.

Her schooling in Italy, following elementary training until the age of ten, was taken at the Palini School where she studied languages, mathematics and the sciences. Having studied English for four years, she speaks the language fluently.

In an interview last week, Elda stated that she was very much impressed with the largeness of this country and the friendliness of everyone here. Highly impressive to her was the number of people in the highways and the fact that so many people live in single family homes. This is in sharp contrast to Italy, she said, where for families own cars and most people in the cities live in multiple dwelling units.

A man doing the same work in America as one in Italy seems to have much more and enjoy a far richer life, Miss Dossela commented. American food is very good, Elda said, and that includes American pizza. She stated that she found the pineapple and cottage cheese salad very strange but also very tasty. The Italian girl enjoys swimming, ice skating, painting and bicycling, and has a flare for cooking. Both boogie and classical music appeal to her. Mrs. Bailey commented that Elda has fitted into the family very nicely and has already become much like a real daughter to her and her husband, and a sister to her son and daughter.
