September 9 Through 15 Dedicated At National Civil Defense Week

The week of September 9 to 15 has been set aside as National Civil Defense Week to pay tribute to civil defense workers throughout the nation and to arouse further CD interest.
In addition to the Federal Civil Defense Administration, State Civil Defense organizations and more than 400 city and county CD agencies in 46 states, Hawaii, Puerto Rico and the Canal Zone have been preparing for this observance.

The week will begin with issuance of a Presidential proclamation and an appearance by President Eisenhower on television. This will be followed by proclamations from mayors and governors and by announcements from pulpits throughout the nation.

ORGANIC CLUBS OF STATE TO MEET SEPTEMBER 15, 16

The Wayne County Organic Gardening and Farming Clubs, including members from Livonia and Farmington, will be among a group of over 500 organic gardeners and farmers from Michigan and neighboring states convening at the Civic Center in Lansing on September 15 and 16 for the Fourth Annual Roundup of the Federated Organic Clubs of Michigan.

Dr. William Coda Martin of New York City, authority on nutrition and outspoken critic of modern food adulteration practices, will talk on "When is Food a Food and When a Poison" at the Sunday afternoon session. Dr. Raymond Girardot, Detroit dentist and member of the American Academy of Nutrition, will discuss "Stumbling Blocks to Good Nutrition" at the morning session, followed by Joseph A. Coconauer, soils specialist and conservationist of Wilburton, Oklahoma, who will speak of "The Soil and You."
The Saturday program will feature field trips to nearby organic gardens and a large organic farm where surface tillage and subsiding practices will be demonstrated, with the latest equipment.
Gardening and farming problems will be discussed in the hall after the trips. On Saturday evening, Professor Donald P. Watson of Michigan State University will talk on "Horticulture is a Therapy."

The Federated Organic Clubs of Michigan is made up of eleven local organic farm and garden clubs scattered throughout the southern peninsula, and a membership-at-large reaching out into several neighboring states. A large display of the products of members' gardens is always a feature of the Roundups. The general public is cordially invited to come and find out for themselves just what the organic movement is all about.

Offer Safety Tips To Help Children Starting School

Five million first-grade scholars are filing into schoolrooms across the nation to begin their education.
Some will never reach the second grade.
Many of these five and six year olds, on "their own" for the first time, will be killed or injured while flocking through dangerous city traffic or hazardous country roads.

To avoid this tragedy parents should set up planned training in safety steps to be followed by youngsters on trips to and from school. This advice comes from Arthur S. Johnson, Director of the Institute for Safer Living of the American Mutual Liability Insurance Company.

The first thing parents should do is work out the safest route to school and then personally escort their children until they are aware of the various hazards.

Parents should make sure while on these training trips that they stop on curbs, look both ways before crossing and cross only at proper crosswalks. Good example is important in teaching safety. Johnson advises parents to walk decisively and not to show nervousness. Point out the danger of cars emerging from driveways and impress upon children the need to obey all traffic officers and school crossing guards.

Teach your child that stormy days are especially dangerous as the autoist's visibility is poor. Warn him against playing in the streets, alleys and driveways on his or her way to school.

The Institute director points out that if you and your neighbors get together on the selecting of a safe route, all of the children are more likely to follow it.

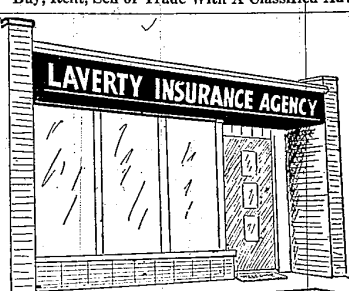

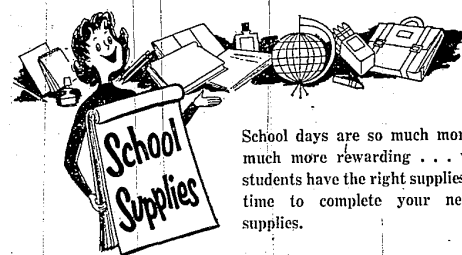

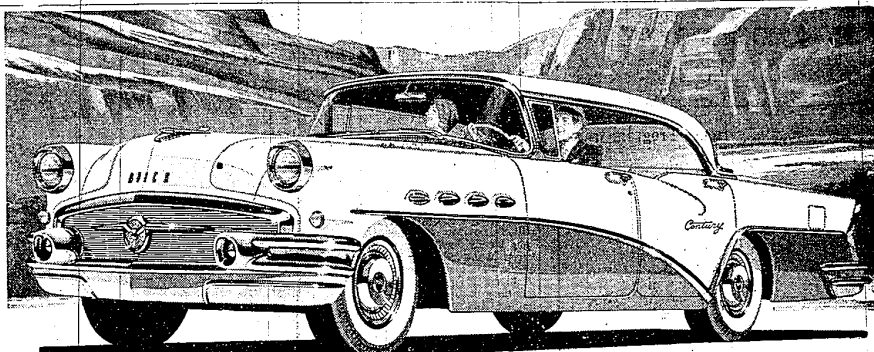
