reported that efforts are now being made to work out a cost sharing agreement between the city, township and County Road Commission for the construction of a drain along Gill Road. The drain is designed to eliminate the flooding conditions on the east side of Gill Road in the city.

In connection with the Bel-Aire drainage problems, Paul Pare, city attorney, stated that, in his opinion, an open drain does not constitute a utility, and as a result the city has no jurisdiction. The city manager and attorney were instructed to check Ordinance C-313 prohibiting the excavation or depositing of top soil on private property to determine if it would pertain to the Bel-Aire drainage problem.

## Correction

During a discussion at the last regular meeting of the City Council held September 24, considerable criticism was leveled at various city officials in regard to drainage and sewer problems in the area adjacent to the Bel-Aire Subdivision.

In reporting the discussion, the Enterprise incorrectly quoted Mrs. James Salley, 42300 Shawnee, as stating that "it was time the city secured a new manager." The statement should have read, "it was time the city secured a new engineer." The reference was made to L. N. Hayden, who is acting as consulting engineer for the city.

school principal, listing all school year dance dates. A notice shall be placed in the school bulletin relative to the need for chaperones and will be subject to contact. In accordance with the suggestion of the Mothers' Club Council, the person to contact is the Secretary of that organization.

The resolution shall have immediate effect. The Board of Education reserves the right to make any changes, amendments or additional regulations as may be deemed necessary for proper control and conduct of school parties.

Action was also taken by the Board entitling cafeteria employees to sick leave benefits. According to the resolution, the employees are entitled to sick leave on the basis of one day per month, cumulative to 30 days. Similar action was taken in regard to school bus drivers. Under a separate resolution, the drivers are entitled to 10 days sick leave annually.

An amendment to the bus drivers' salary schedule was approved to provide for a minimum of \$1.75 per hour and a maximum of \$2.00 per hour. The minimum salary covers bus drivers with no experience in the district, while the maximum includes drivers with five or more years experience. The schedule provides for a 5c per hour increase each year to the maximum. Officials stated that the schedule will take effect with the October 15 pay period.




