
Before his arrival at Saudi Arabia, he also had some interesting stops at the Holy Land and other places of note.

Federal Work Force Cut,
State Forces Increased

The number of Federal government workers has been cut 424,000—from 2,600,000 to 2,176,000—in the last four years. But state and local government workers continue to increase in a steady upward trend, a recent survey revealed.

Only 30 per cent of the total of 7,000,000 government civilian employees today are Federal workers—and half of them work for the Department of Defense, while a quarter are postal employees.

Of the 70 per cent working for state and local governments, three out of four work for local and one out of four for state; 45 per cent of them are in the field of education.

All in all, one out of every seven U. S. workers in non-agricultural fields, and not counting the armed forces, is in Federal, state or local employ.

Since 1933, \$5.5 billion worth of agricultural surpluses have been moved from storage, and farm exports have increased by 11 per cent.

There are approximately 32, 800,000 students enrolled in the nation's public elementary and secondary schools, according to the U. S. Office of Education.

Booklet On Preparing Wild Game Available

Michigan's fall hunting seasons usually mean outdoor enjoyment for the man of the house, but also can cause anxious moments for the wife unfamiliar with methods of cooking game meat.

"Good Eating From Woods and Fields," a free, 24-page booklet of game recipes, can be a boon companion to bewildered housewives. The popular booklet again is available from the Conservation Department as hunting seasons get underway.

The publication lists a variety of recipes for such small game as pheasant, rabbit, duck, goose, grouse, woodcock, squirrel, beaver, raccoon, opossum, woodchuck and muskrat. Methods of dressing, preparing and preserving game meat are included.

The booklet was published in cooperation with Michigan State University and can be obtained by a post card request to Conservation Department Publications, Lansing 26.
