Did You Know

When a fuse blows, screw a 25-watt bulb into the fuse socket. If the trouble is a short, the bulb will light brightly; if the circuit is overloaded the bulb will light dimly.

Use the leg of an old nylon stocking to line the lower sleeve of a wool sweater that "itches." It will give a perfect fit and will keep the sweater elbows from wearing out so quickly.

To lick the problem of babies tearing off the sheets in a one-year crib, sew sheets in the form of a large pillow case that will slip over the mattress and cannot be pulled out. Both sides can be used.

A mirror over the stationary tub behind the washing machine will tell you if clothes are going smoothly through the wringer, without tangle.

A nut pick in your sewing basket can be handy. Turn belts with the blunt end, use the sharp end for rolling out corners after the belt is turned, also for removing stitches.

Two dime-store clamp-on clips, connected with a piece of ribbon and clipped to an old wash rag or piece of towel makes a good baby bib, and they eliminate those washing headaches, tangled strings and torn-off buttons.
