The Novi Rebekah Lodge will hold its regular meeting on December 13 at the I.O.O.F. Hall.

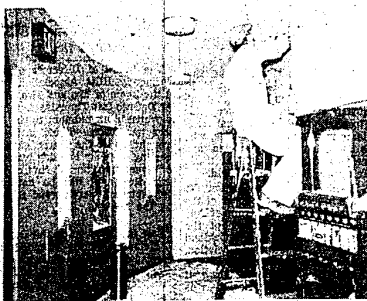
Mrs. Frank Tamm spent the week-end in Dayton and Springfield, Illinois.

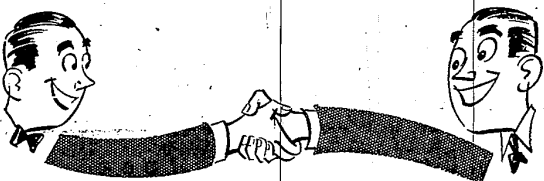

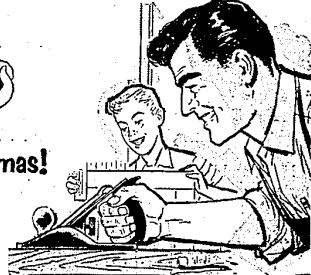
