Wondering about the new pre-stuffed turkeys that are on the market now? According to Dr. Dana Cederquist, head of the food and nutrition department at Michigan State University, they are safe up to the point they are sold and taken from the dealer. Your handling of them determines their degree of safety so remember to keep them under refrigeration at all times to prevent growth of food poisoning bacteria.

Dr. Cederquist also advises to take regular turkeys out of the refrigerator only if they are frozen and need to be thawed.

Area College Grads Invited To Take Training For Elementary Teaching

Registrations for the post-degree teacher education program where by men and women with Liberal Arts college backgrounds can become certified elementary school teachers are now being taken.

This is the cooperative plan which has won county-wide recognition as a realistic method of bringing highly qualified men and women into the teaching profession. The Wayne State University cooperative plan has been endorsed by the United States Office of Education and has been adopted by teacher education colleges and school systems from coast to coast.

The program offers men and women with bachelor degrees from accredited colleges an opportunity to complete the required courses, workshops, and in-school teaching needed for a Michigan teaching certificate. Persons enrolling now will be able to complete their work this summer and be certified for full-time teaching assignments in September.

On May 28, 1957, three post-degree teacher certification program centers will be operating in the greater metropolitan area.

For those living in the western suburbs of Detroit a center has been established in the Haston Junior High School at 2425 Hass Road, in the Telegraph and Warren area. This has been set up in cooperation with the Dearborn No. 4 school district and with school superintendents in adjacent areas.

A Royal Oak center available to men and women living in Oakland County and other areas north of Detroit has been set up in the Clarence Kimball High School, at 1500 Lexington Road near Crooks Road.

College alumni in the areas east and northeast of Detroit can do their post-degree study in the Fitzgerald School in Macomb County at 23200 Ryan Road and Nine Mile.

The post degree teacher certification program consists of 18 weeks of student-teaching in or near the student's home community and participating in an off-campus workshop in elementary education which meets three afternoons each week in the three centers.

Student teaching is carried on five full mornings each week.

Applicants who apply now for the spring semester program will be able to attend six credits summer session where courses are offered in "The History and Philosophy of Education," "Survey of Public Education," and "Literature, Art and Science Materials for Elementary Schools."

Satisfactory completion of the program, involving the earning of at least 20 semester hours credit in professional education, will enable participants to apply for positions with school boards anywhere in Michigan.

Qualified men and women under 50 years of age who apply immediately can begin their training during the spring session and upon completion of the program in August can qualify for a Michigan Provisional Teaching Certificate.

Education Pays Off
One of the most significant statistics to come out of the study of "Who Owns American Business" concerns the educational level of shareholders. Of the millions of individual Americans who own stock 7.5 per cent completed only the 8th grade in school, 11.5 per cent had from one to three years in high school, 33.2 per cent are high school graduates, 18.6 had some college education, and 22.2 are college graduates. In other words, the better the education the better the chance for economic advancement — generally speaking.

And this factor is looming larger all the time as we advance from one scientific plateau to another. All the parents in America should encourage their children to seek a college education. A college education has its measurable value to the individual; it has a definite value also to the family, and it has a value to the nation. The larger our percentage of college graduates, the higher will be the living standard of all Americans, the greater the enjoyment of all the citizens in this wonderful land of the free.

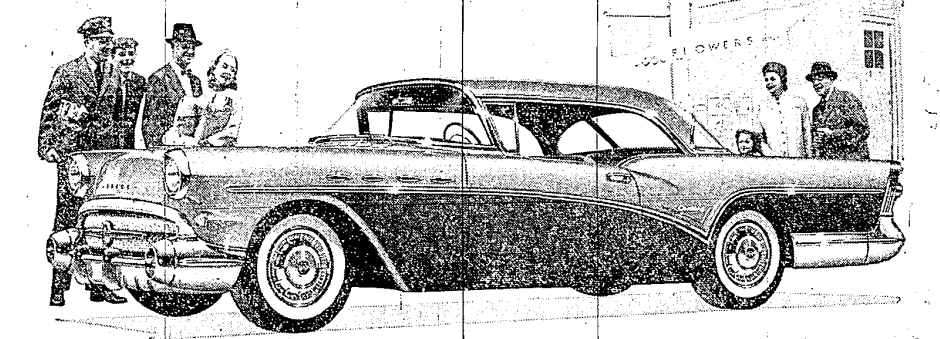
