The F. Ramseys of Dearborn visited at the home of their daughter and her family on Sunday.

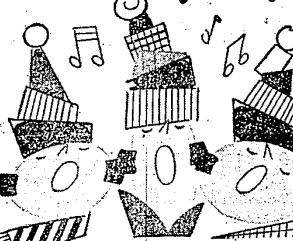
Mr. and Mrs. Albert Schroder of Fenelon were Saturday visitors at the Waite home.

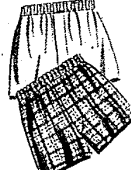
