## Supply-Demand Only Control On Meat Prices

Have you ever wondered who sets livestock and meat prices? The fact is that nobody sets the prices but something does. That something goes by the name of the law of supply and demand. Francis A. Kutish of Iowa State College has explained how this law works in the case of meat. The main thing in the demand part of the picture is the number of dollars in the consumer market. "Consumer demand," he writes, "consumer income doesn't change much from one day or week or month to the next. So when livestock marketings go up, about the only way prices are stretched over a larger market supply - and prices have to give. Then when marketings go down, consumers pay less for the smaller meat supply."  
Of the producers' situation, Mr. Kutish says: "Each livestock raiser has his own idea of how much to produce and when to sell. With several million separate decisions being made, there's bound to be a lot of ups and downs and no one meat packer can get away with low-price buying or retailer with high-price selling - for very long. If they didn't get better prices in a hurry, individual producers and consumers would simply deal with someone else."

Finally, Mr. Kutish disposes of the idea that packers or retailers can set the prices. There are more than 3,000 packers and 10,000 other commercial killers, and 300,000 retailers who sell meat. To quote him again, "That means no one meat packer can get away with low-price buying or retailer with high-price selling - for very long. If they didn't get better prices in a hurry, individual producers and consumers would simply deal with someone else."

## Fear Many Fawns

**To Starve This Winter In State**  
Deer starvation which took a heavy toll in Michigan last winter - threatens the current fawn crop in food shortage areas. A critical situation, according to the Michigan Department of Conservation, is based on studies of the physical condition of deer during the recent hunting seasons. For example, in Area 2 - the 930-square-mile area centered around Baldwin - all antlerless deer taken by hunters were examined by Department personnel.  
Game biologists found that fawn weights in this food shortage area were far below what is considered a "safe" autumn level. The average weight (field dressed) of fawns taken in the special seasons was slightly more than 50 pounds. Feeding experiments show that fawns on good diets should weigh about 70 pounds (field dressed) in the fall if they are in good physical condition.  
During the winter, the average 70-pound fawn can lose about 30 percent - or approximately one-third of its weight and still survive. This 20-pound safety margin has been seriously reduced for fawns in Area 2.

## Female Skunks Denned Up; Males Roaming About

"If you see a skunk these cold winter days, you can almost bet on its being a male," says Prof. William H. Burt, curator of mammals in the Department of Zoology at The University of Michigan.  
"The females are denning up now - sometimes eight or ten in a den, and you probably won't see them until the winter is broken. The males don't remain in the dens except in extremely cold weather, but safely for at intervals throughout the winter month," he says.  
He continues, "Skunks are probably polygamous. Mating takes place in late February or early March, and the young are born in a litter (usually about six), are born about the first of May.  
"By late June or early July the mother brings up her young, and they accompany her as she searches for food. They grow rapidly and usually are in good condition, with plenty of fat on their bodies when the cold of winter sets in.  
"Normal fall and early winter population of skunks in good territory in southern Michigan is about one skunk to each 10 acres," Professor Burt says.  
The skunk, better known for its power than for its beauty, depends on its scent-spraying mechanism for protection, he explains.  
"But he uses it only in emergencies. If you're so unfortunate as to see a skunk, you need fear no lasting bad effects. Your eyes will burn and you will be blinded temporarily, but within a few minutes your eyes clean, and the painful effects - albeit not odor! - will have disappeared. To do this I can attest by personal experience," he adds humbly.  
Continuing Burt says, "You may have seen this rather formidable creature roaming the fields, fence rows, swamps, and looking for food. More likely you have seen him a victim of highway traffic. He's black with a white stripe on his forehead, a white patch on the side of his head and two white stripes fanning out on the back and extending over the back for varying distances, usually to his long tail."  
"The skunk comes out from his daytime sleep shortly after sundown and starts his search for insects, grub-like creatures, berries, and small animals he may encounter in his wanderings as the professor.

## Caution Against Over Working Heart In Winter

Old man winter is now officially with us, according to the Michigan Heart Association, it is time to give thought to "winterizing" ourselves as well as our houses and automobiles.  
"We're many people," says E. A. Irvin, M.D., Dearborn, president of the association, "fail to realize that winter can be very hard on the heart. The incidence of heart attacks is much greater during the winter months, and all of us must learn to take it a little easier."  
Wearing heavy, bulky clothes, overshoots and rubbers, fighting icy winds, slippery sidewalks and snow drifts can overtax the heart. The body in combating the cold, all make the heart work harder and faster. Add to this the strain put on the heart by winter influenza and even such a strong organ as the heart may have trouble.  
This advice applies particularly to those past 40 who may be strenuous or who exercise or do undue physical exertion. This group especially must learn to "Take It Easy". Learn to slow down, to take things easy at all times, and perhaps leave the strenuous winter sports, to the youngsters, says the authorities.  
For all, young, middle-aged or elderly, the Michigan Heart Association, a United Fund Agency, offers the following suggestions for "winterizing" ourselves:  
1. Get a complete physical check-up by your family physician.  
2. Do your winter work and play at a pace which will not make you over-tired.  
3. Keep your weight down to normal.  
4. Get plenty of rest.  
5. Avoid excitement.  
6. For further information about heart disease, write to HEART care of your local post office.

## First All-Boat Show in Detroit Opens Feb. 2

A wide array of pleasure craft and motor equipment will go on display at the "Detroit" Artillery Armory February 2 when the Boat Show opens.  
The nine-day event, first all-boat show ever staged in Michigan, will occupy the entire 360,000 square feet of floor space available in the Armory, largest building in the city.  
More than 150 exhibitors will show 350 boats of all types, ranging from 45-foot motor yachts, clear to the smallest of light-duty, clear plastic prams. Outboard motors, from the newest six cylinder 60 h.p. models to 20-hp 2-stroke models, will vie for attention with inboard engines having horsepower ranging up to 350.  
In addition to quantities of marine hardware and boat accessories, visitors will be able to view the latest radio telephones, electronic depth indicators, and radar equipment.  
Displays will be so distributed in the huge hall that the public may wander at will in all directions, instead of being confined to aisles. Detroit's first all-boat show will offer not only the most advanced items of interest to the boat-loving fraternity, but numerous unusual historic displays.  
Typical is an exhibit to be sent by the Old Dartmouth Historic Society and Whaling Museum, consisting of harpoons, and other equipment used by early American whalers.  
Models of six historic ships will be shown by the Smithsonian Institution, U. S. National Museum, Washington, D. C.  
The Detroit Artillery Armory, situated on 8 Mile Road between Grand and Woodward Avenues in Northwest Detroit, is just a half mile from Northland Shopping Center.

## Supply-Demand Only Control On Meat Prices

Have you ever wondered who sets livestock and meat prices? The fact is that nobody sets the prices but something does. That something goes by the name of the law of supply and demand. Francis A. Kutish of Iowa State College has explained how this law works in the case of meat. The main thing in the demand part of the picture is the number of dollars in the consumer market. "Consumer demand," he writes, "consumer income doesn't change much from one day or week or month to the next. So when livestock marketings go up, about the only way prices are stretched over a larger market supply - and prices have to give. Then when marketings go down, consumers pay less for the smaller meat supply."  
Of the producers' situation, Mr. Kutish says: "Each livestock raiser has his own idea of how much to produce and when to sell. With several million separate decisions being made, there's bound to be a lot of ups and downs and no one meat packer can get away with low-price buying or retailer with high-price selling - for very long. If they didn't get better prices in a hurry, individual producers and consumers would simply deal with someone else."

Finally, Mr. Kutish disposes of the idea that packers or retailers can set the prices. There are more than 3,000 packers and 10,000 other commercial killers, and 300,000 retailers who sell meat. To quote him again, "That means no one meat packer can get away with low-price buying or retailer with high-price selling - for very long. If they didn't get better prices in a hurry, individual producers and consumers would simply deal with someone else."
