Swim Accident Victim, Ed Chabala, Home For Holiday Season With Family

Ed Chabala of 31616 Leelanau who was paralyzed from the waist down in a tragic swimming accident the latter part of this summer is now home with his wife, Ellen, and two small children, 14, 12, and 10 years old, and Stephen, 8 months old.

He will return to the Veterans Hospital in Dearborn on Friday, January 4, for further treatment in hopes of bringing movement in his body back to normal again. It is reported that the doctors are contemplating surgery of an exploratory nature in hopes of finding out exactly what complications are involved. Ed has been confined to the hospital since the time of the accident undergoing treatment. During the early weeks following the tragedy, Mr. Chabala was unable to move any part of his body and it was feared that he might never be able to walk or move his arms or hands again.

Receiving physical therapy treatment at the Veterans' Hospital, it is reported that Chabala is gaining strength in his arms and is now able to move them over his head. It was indicated, however, that he still has no use of his hands and that he has to be moved every three hours from his back to his stomach. He is now able to spend two hours every day setting up in a wheel chair.

He is being allowed now to come out of the Veterans' Hospital to the home of his wife and family.

Tips On Setting Up Bird Feeder Station Given

Winter feeding of songbirds is not badly needed during a normal Michigan winter but it can bring pleasure to persons who play hosts to the wild birds. A feeding station can provide an opportunity to dole out and enjoy birds, says Don Juchartz, Wayne County Horticultural Agent.

Wild birds attracted to feeding stations add to the natural surroundings of a home and provide color and life to the landscape when many birds are south for the winter.

Not hatches, blue jays, brown creepers, chickadees, juncos, grosbeaks and other birds can be attracted to yards by providing them with cracked corn, suet, bread crumbs, weed seeds and small grains. Grit is also an aid to birds' digestion, Juchartz said.

Once a feeding station is established, attend it daily. Cutting down on the food would be a hardship for birds accustomed to feeding there. Food for songbirds can be placed in a simple wooden tray fastened to a window sill or mounted on a five-foot post. The tray should be 2 feet by 2 feet and have sides about 2 to 3 inches high.

Discarded Christmas trees also can be used to good advantage as songbird feeders. Suet, toast and other table scraps can be hung from the branches. Pheasants and quail are ground feeders and will appreciate corn and grit scattered on the ground or corn ears placed upright on spikes projecting from a one-inch board holder.

Deer Turn Backs On Feed Station

Snow can chase deer away from a "free lunch" counter, according to reports from the federal Fish and Wildlife Service on game studies conducted during the last year.

In a federal aid research project reported to the Fish and Wildlife Service, attempts were made in South Dakota to set up winter feeding stations for deer in the Black Hills.

The deer feeding stations were stocked with alfalfa hay, dry corn on the cob and an especially prepared deer concentrate. South Dakota authorities found that all went fairly smoothly until a heavy January snowfall, when deer turned their backs on the well-stocked feeding stations and moved down into ranch country.

The deer apparently were "willing to take 'pollock' in the low country, rather than sure feed in the snowy hills, the report concluded.

This study is one of the many state-federal cooperative projects conducted under the Pittman-Robertson program. In this program, federal and state funds are used to finance game restoration and research projects.
