5-Cent Insurance Rate For Parcels Discontinued

A change in policy for the insuring of domestic parcels for mailing at \$10 or under was disclosed this week by local postal department officials.

Starting January 2 of this year the 5-cent insurance fee was discontinued. A fee of 10-cents is now being charged for all parcels issued for \$10 or any amount under \$10. It was indicated that firm mailers with stocks of printed labels or wrappers showing either the 5-cent or 10-cent fee would be permitted to continue using these labels or wrappers but that the 10-cent fee would be charged regardless.

Clarenceville Cemetery Assn. To Meet Jan. 15

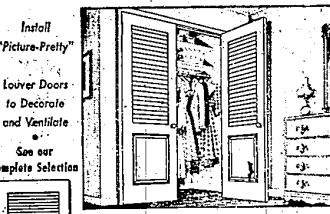
