Report 68 Pct. Business Growth In Farmington

Growth and business development of Farmington is reflected in statistics released by Dun and Bradstreet last week, occasioned by that firm's annual mailing of requests for financial statements to businessmen across the nation. Some 287 businesses, comprising retailers, wholesalers and manufacturers in Farmington, received these requests.

This year's figure represents a 68 per cent increase over the number of firms which were listed in the Dun and Bradstreet Reference Book ten years ago, officials of the organization indicated.

Through this mailing of requests for financial statements, underwritten by Dun and Bradstreet each year, the businessmen of Farmington are able to get their latest year-end financial statements to suppliers, banks and insurance companies, without delay and at no expense, it was pointed out.

As a credit agency, Dun and Bradstreet acts as a confidential clearing house for both buyers and sellers. Its primary function is to assist in building the buyer-seller relationship thus facilitating the flow of merchandise on a credit basis. This work is carried out through the issuance of the agency subscribers, a Reference Book, which shows the name, line of business and credit rating for 2,900,000 businesses. In addition detailed credit reports are available on all businesses listed in the Reference Book as well as on several hundred thousand enterprises of a service nature which are not listed in the Reference Book.

When the owner of a business returns his financial statement to Dun and Bradstreet, he has taken the first step in establishing his responsibility as a seeker of credit, officials of the organization stated.

As financial statements are received, the information contained in them is made readily available for all interested agency subscribers. The financial statement is incorporated in the detailed credit report which describes the background and experience of the owners, facts regarding financial condition and paying record.

Through this medium, credit grantors are able to follow the purpose, progress, problems and potential of the outlets through which their goods and services move, it was concluded.

Falcons Score Second League Victory, Beat Southfield 61-45

Paced by the sharpshooting artistry of Bud Jones and Don MacDonald, the Farmington Falcons chalked up an impressive 61-45 victory over the Southfield Bluejays last Friday night.

Jones pumped in 27 points and MacDonald, 21, accounting for nearly 60 per cent of the team's total scoring efforts. Nearly half of Jones' 13 points came in the free throw line, where he has been exceptionally stellar in every contest thus far this season.

Playing before a capacity crowd on their home floor, the Falcons got off to a slow start in the opening portion of the game. At the end of the first quarter they trailed the Jays by one point, 18-17.

In the second quarter the Falcons quieted, playing a controlled type of ball, began to find the mark more consistently and by half-time pushed ahead. They left the floor at mid-point in the game leading 32-28.

Continuing to play in the same manner in the third canno, the Falcons widened the margin a few points more and then in the final stanza put on a big push to widen the scoring margin despite strong efforts by the Jay quintet to rally back.

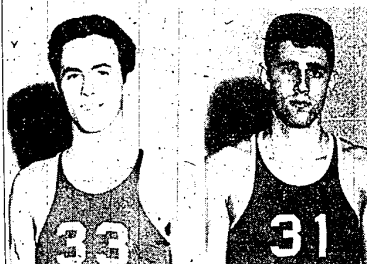

Jones hit on 7 field goals in 17 attempts for a 41 per cent average and MacDonald scored 8 field goals in 18 attempts. Jones continued to prove a big helping factor for his team at the free throw line, putting in 13 of 14 shots attempted. Thus far this season, Jones has picked up 30 points via the free throw line in 34 attempts for an amazing 88 per cent in this department. MacDonald, a high scorer, has also been outstanding on rebounding for the team. He has collected 84 rebounds thus far this year, or approximately one-third of the team's total.

Deer Cause Considerable Damage To Farm Crops

Area Two, a seven-county unit centering around Baldwin, was designated for special "any deer" hunting this fall because deer over-browse their natural food range in the area and sometimes feed on crops, causing damage. The Conservation Department said. Reports from residents indicate the area's deer problem is not solved yet.

A lifer near Luther recently requested a special permit from the Conservation Department to shoot deer damaging his crops. He reported some 20 to 30 whitetails digging up his wheat field.

Some 2030 antlerless deer were taken by permit holders in the 930 square-mile Area Two this fall in a special season which ran concurrently with the regular November 15-30 buck season.

Falcons Frosh Chalk Up Second Win, Beat Southfield

The Farmington freshman cage team chalked up their second victory in as many starts last week by downing Southfield 41-30 last week.

In their only other contest thus far this season, the Falcons Frosh won a thriller from a strong Highland Park freshmen club, 32-31. Harvey Chapman was the big gun in this contest racking in 20 points for the cause.

Questionnaires Going Out Seeking Information On State Deer Hunting

Some 16,000 Michigan hunters are being asked to supply deer hunting information in the Conservation Department's annual post-card survey of hunting activity and success.

Questionnaires designed to gather information on the 1936 special season were mailed to more than 6,000 deer hunters in early December. About two-thirds of the post card replies from this mailing had been received by the Department by December 28. Reminder cards, urging prompt replies, were mailed to hunters who had not answered.

Another 10,000 questionnaires will be sent out during the next few weeks to a different group of hunters, seeking information on the regular deer season.

In this survey, a statistically-based cross-section of hunters are asked about their hunting success or lack of it—and hunting activity. Data obtained in the survey provides a close estimate of the total kill, hunting distribution and other basic information used in establishing hunting regulations and in other aspects of deer herd management.

Under the present system, every fourth hunter on license lists is contacted in the regular season survey. The high rate of cooperation among hunters—as many as 96 per cent respond—adds in the poll's accuracy.

Results of the poll won't be known until early spring, after all replies are received and processed.

GARNISHING

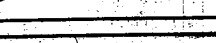
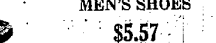
