police department radio services were tabled. Council expressed concern over the fact that the Township Board had agreed to pay over \$2,400 this year for all services rendered by the Township Police Department.

A request was also made by the Council that a study be conducted to determine whether the Township could not be required to pay for or reimburse the portion of the Town Hall owned by the City but being used exclusively for Township business.

A recommendation made by the City Manager that the parking zone on the north side of Grand River Avenue east of Power Road be extended from 50 to 200 feet was unanimously approved by the Council.

Mrs. Lillian Peterson in a communication to the Council requested that the city pay \$16.15 in damages incurred as a result of an accident in which her daughter was involved on city property.

Another communication asking that the city pledge its full cooperation in a long range project to halt the future flooding of the Rouge River Basin in Washtenaw County was tabled for further study.
