Nearly All Can Be Called Government Workers

"Taxpayer's Dollar," a publication of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, passes on this definition of a taxpayer: "A person who doesn't have to pass a Civil Service test to work for the government."

That's more than a good gag, statistics compiled by the Industrial News Review show. A man with two dependents who earns \$50 a week must work 4.9 weeks to meet his tax bill. If he has no dependents, he has to work 8.2 weeks. And, of course, the tax rates rise with almost bullet-like rapidity as income rises—and the amount of time a man has to work for the government rises with it. So, in this fashion, we're all government workers. And we have to do a great deal more work on behalf of government than most of us realize, the report concluded.

Now, just two weeks before their first anniversary, members and friends of the Church are preparing to move their place of worship to a new site of the church which was just recently purchased from the Sheldon Realty Company of Detroit. The property is located on the north side of Thirteen Mile Road, one-half mile west of Orchard Lake Road.

The first services at the Bond Chapel will be held February 2 at 9:45 a.m. morning worship, 11 a.m. and the family fellowship hour beginning at 7 p.m., with nursery available at all services.

North Farmington Baptist Church is being sponsored jointly by the Covenant Baptist Church of Detroit, the Detroit Association of American Baptist Churches and the Home Mission Council of the American Baptist Convention.

Franklin Church Men Planning Fund Drive

Over 100 men were consecrated as Crusade callers last Sunday morning at the Franklin Community Church. Robert J. Searls, Minister of the Church, conducted the service at which the Reverend Forrest Hedden, Crusade Director, preached.

Heading the callers as campaign director was Dr. Lloyd McKinney, whose executive committee included Dr. J. Crawford, Donald G. Tracy and Roy C. Trontauze as well as Mr. Searls and Mr. Hedden.

The purpose of the \$100,000 drive, according to Mr. McKinney is to lower the indebtedness and provide a "cushion" for latter additions to the new structure on Franklin's Village Green.

The initial drive two years ago for \$195,000 was successful and a beautiful new church was constructed. Long range plans call for a social hall and educational wing to be built on the south and a small chapel on the west. Construction of a new parsonage is contemplated as well.

One hundred twenty men-callers and captains have been recruited and are being trained by Mr. Hedden. The calls will be made on the afternoon of January 27 and on the following evenings with a victory report to be held the night of January 30.
