The West Farmington Farm Bureau met at the home of Mrs. Shirley Hultz at 28450 Haggerty Road on Tuesday, January 15, with 11 families present.

As the group is now divided and it is stipulated that no farm group should carry the name of a township in which it is located, a new name for the group was selected. As members of the group are near what was once known as "Penabuco Hollow" that name was selected as the new name for the group.

In 1827 a John T. Little bought a tract of land in Section 17 of Farmington Township and named

it Penabuco Hollow after his home town in Brazil. He built a grist mill on the water fall to run the mill. Later Edward and Harman Steel bought and ran the mill after which it was sold and ran by Aron Smith, Joseph Coon, John Little-Hardenburg and Henry Wadenstorer in that order before being sold to its present owner. The mill was torn down some years ago.

After a membership classification committee was appointed, Wallace Williams led a discussion on "promotion representing all Michigan products to the public will stimulate consumers acceptance." Also discussed was the need for more research in marketing state products and the need to convince the State Legislature of this need.
