Offers Free Pony Rides For Kiddies

Children of the Farmington area wanting a pony ride for free are invited to visit the John F. Ivory's stable grounds, 2990 Cooley Lake Road, any weekend. The grounds are situated approximately eight miles west of Pontiac, in White Lake Township.

Adults are welcome, if accompanied by children. It was pointed out that six handsome pony hitches will be on hand to assure all the youngsters an unforgettable time, officials at the Polgrounig commented.

The free rides are offered after school on Friday, on Saturday beginning at 2 p.m. and on Sunday starting at 1 p.m.

Mr. Ivory started his hobby of raising pony riders for kiddies in 1951. There are now 47 ponies in the stable, including what may be the only two all-Palomino hitches in the country.

Since he acquired the 130-acre Pichaven estate, Mr. Ivory has given the grounds an extensive facelift, including the removal of approximately 3,500 trees and the building of some five miles of road around the grounds. These roads through the idyllic estate are perfect for the pony hitches to travel.

Those who drop in to see the ponies and enjoy the rides can relax in the 14-room club house on the grounds while awaiting their turn.

While the snow lasts, six sleighs will be provided for the rides. When the snow is gone, specially built wagons will be used.

The ponies will also be provided, without charge, to entice any bona fide party for children within a 50-mile radius of Detroit, Mr. Ivory commented. Further information may be obtained by writing Mr. Ivory at 2990 Cooley Lake Road.

Detroit Edison Pays Heavy Local Tax Bill

A total of \$18,900,000 is being paid by The Detroit Edison Company to cities, villages, and townships of Southeastern Michigan in local taxes.

In Oakland County the company's 1956 taxes, which will go into funds for new schools, road improvements and other development vital to the county's growth and advancement, add up to \$1,566,000.

Throughout Edison's 7,600-square-mile service area, local school districts alone will receive about \$7,000,000 from the company. This figure, which includes metropolitan Detroit and Michigan's "Thumb," comprises seven entire counties and parts of six others, Edison officials said.

Ratio of Edison taxes to the total taxes collected in any specific locality varies widely, of course, with the amount of property owned locally by the company. As to the overall ratio, the total of property taxes to be paid by companies and individuals throughout Detroit Edison's whole service area is estimated at \$28,000,000.

Edison's \$18,900,000 tax bill therefore amounts to about 5.7 percent of all taxes received by the 350 villages, cities and townships served by the company.

Howard L. Canfield, manager of Edison's Oakland District, points out that the total local state and federal taxes to be paid by the company for 1956 amounts to almost as much as the cost of all the fuel used in producing the electric power the company buys.
