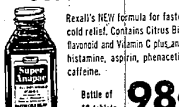

Farmington Elementary School Head Cites Needs For Multi-Purpose Rooms

If a school program is to be effective, it must be geared to the education of the whole child. Concepts derived from the study of child growth and development emphasize a curriculum which will meet all the needs of the individual child. Therefore it behooves us to plan a curriculum which gives consideration to mental, social, emotional, and physical growth of pupils. Miss Bonnie Zinke, elementary co-ordinator, stated in pointing out that the need for multi-purpose rooms at all elementary schools in the District.

One definition of curriculum is "The Learners Environment in Action." This implies that the factors contributing to the education of a pupil is justifiable. Thus, child education should be planned to include each aspect of the child's development in the four before mentioned general categories. Studies have shown that these phases of child growth cannot be isolated, often they overlap and are interrelated, she pointed out.

"In Farmington, while every effort is being made to do a good job in contributing to the mental growth of the child and providing a good social atmosphere in the classroom, as the physical aspect is neglected, our over-all school program is limited as the lack of the necessary facilities handicaps our health and physical education program, it in turn weakens the whole curriculum structure," she said.

A suitable program would have objectives such as:

1. To develop the ability to use the body skillfully in work and play.
2. To develop that muscular strength necessary to maintain good posture at rest and in motion so as to ease the tasks of each day.
3. To provide children with a resource for constructive use of leisure time—to educate them in skills so that they can become self-active in their leisure time.

Thrifty Republican Leaders have lightened the party's purse strings around the proposal to put the GOP state chairmanship on a full time yearly salary of \$20,000. At least the idea is temporarily shelved. Instead, the new state chairman, Lawrence B. Lindemer, 35-year old Stockbridge lawyer, will receive the same compensation as his predecessor, \$75 a day for each day he works.

The question of where the money would come from appears to be at the root of the decision. "We have no way of knowing how much money we can raise for the party," says Berry N. Beaman, the Republican's finance director.

The decision is in sharp contrast to recommendations made by the GOP campaign committee. In addition to the full time salary proposed for the state chairman, it was also agreed that a professional campaign director be hired and the present party staff be increased.

The State Central Committee is holding off a decision on this question for the moment. However, party leaders promise to "take another look at the situation after the April elections."

A Quick Sidestep by legislative investors studying the use of trading stamps as a means to lure the housewife's dollar, has stopped any possible controlling legislation from appearing before the present state legislature.

The commission, composed of Senators Haskell L. Nichols (R-Jackson), Philip Rahol (D-Iron Mountain) and John Milam (R-Traverse City) was appointed by Governor Williams to look into charges that trading stamps were a method of unfair competition.

In the face of assertions by many businesses that they must raise prices to consumers to give trading stamps, the committee report walked a tight line saying that no controls are needed now, and then recommending further study of the problem.

The commission's report gave the gummed stickers a clean bill of health for the present on the basis that they are "a form of advertising" and the "public has accepted them as a matter of right."

8. To promote character standards.

10. To develop skills and understandings which are inherent in the athletics of our culture. But, with major emphasis on participation.

These objectives can be met with adequate indoor and outdoor facilities through a good physical education program. A physical education program that would:

1. Contribute to physical development of pupils.
2. Divert energy into constructive channels.
3. Encourage democratic education (teamwork and cooperation).
4. Instill school spirit—one school concept (I belong).
5. Provide recreation for leisure—education for use of leisure time now and as an adult.
6. Develop better posture and social poise.
7. Aid students as they prepare for the development of specific skills necessary for competitive sports used at a later date.
8. Other activities to be carried out might include:
 1. Assembly programs
 2. Dramatization of creative expression, social development, and role playing through correlation with language arts and social studies.
 3. Rhythm work, dancing, and singing games.
 4. Instrumental work.
 5. Group participation in music.
 6. Parent-student activities.
 7. Free-play activities.
 8. Combative and self-testing activities.
 9. Community activities.

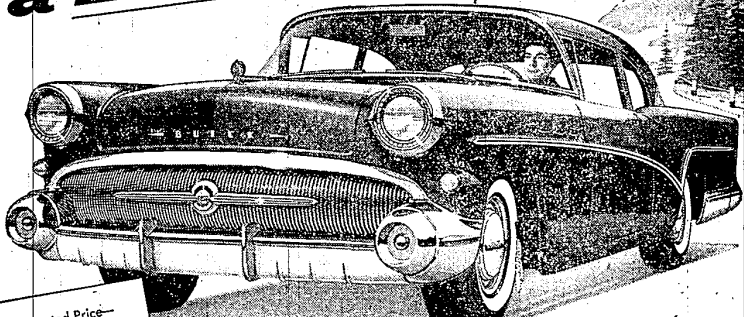
