Named To A Top National Credit Union Position
Robert Dolan of 22334 Warner Avenue was recently named Director of Organization at the Credit Union National Association. He assumed his duties a little over a week ago at Madison, Wisconsin.
As director of the recently established department, Dolan will work with credit union groups throughout North America giving impetus to the organizing of new credit unions. CUNA now serves over 22,000 credit unions in North America with 10 million members.
Dolan previously was coordinator of field services for the Michigan Credit Union League. He entered credit union work in 1951 as a field representative of the Missouri Credit Union League. The new director established an outstanding record in organizing credit unions in both Missouri and Michigan, according to H. B. Yates, managing director of CUNA.
Dolan was born in Kansas City, Missouri and was graduated from Notre Dame in 1940. He served four years in the finance branch of the Air Force during World War II. He is married and has two children. Dolan will move his family to Madison in June. He is living temporarily at the Hotel Lorraine.

holders got 4 per cent. People owning real property got 3 1/2 per cent and bondholders received 3 1/2 per cent.
But, you may ask, what about dollar income to families? In the last year for which we have official figures, there were 50 million families in the U. S. and these families received an income of \$242 billion—before taxes. Forty per cent, or nearly 21 million families, received incomes from \$0 to \$5,000. Fifteen million or 30 per cent received \$5,000 or more. These two groups contain 70 per cent of the population.
Of the remaining 30 per cent of the families, approximately 14 per cent received from \$2,000 to \$3,000, 11 per cent from \$3,000 to \$5,000 and about 5 per cent under \$1,000. Many farm families, retired persons and pensioners, whose cash income does not truly reflect their living standard, are in these lower income categories. The big fact is: 85 per cent of all income went to 83 per cent of our families. In other words, the great bulk of income goes to the majority of families, in the middle income range.
