Change Setting
To Present Play
"High Ground"

The West Bloomfield Players, in selecting Charlotte, H. A. Jones' "High Ground" for their March 8-9 production, faced the decision of whether to leave the play in its original English setting or revise it to fit American customs.

A melodrama of a young murderess who, on her way to execution is forced to take refuge in a convent hospital, the play was an outstanding success in New York and London, but was never produced locally.

After deciding to switch the play's locale to a familiar American setting, the Players went about changing place names, legal and medical terms, English customs and idioms into everyday American speech.

The Players decided on California as the new locale, where floods are not unknown, a neutral American tongue is spoken and San Quentin penitentiary is close to mission hospitals.

A new village, Santa Ynez, was created and placed within several miles of the San Quentin death house.

"High Ground" is the fourth production of the year-old town-ship Players and will be presented in the West Bloomfield High School Orchard Lake and Commerce Roads, Keego Harbor.
