The number of deer killed by highway traffe in Michigan last year soared to 3127, an increase of more than 22 per cent over the 1985 total. The figure does ninclude deer which were fastally included ever which were fastally included ever which were fastally included and lost in the woods after accidents.

The traffic hazards created by deer are sharply emphasized by the steady increase in highway deer deaths, throughout the state. The reported toll was 2522 in 1985; 1871 in 1985; and 1485 in 1985.
