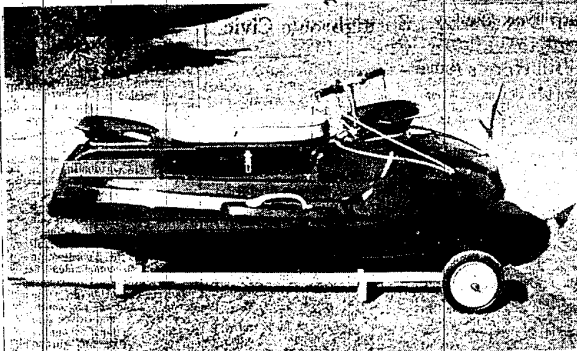

Local Garden Club Joins To Effort To Have Highway 'Scenic Easements'

The Farmington Garden Club has joined other garden clubs across the nation in a concerted effort to have legislation passed requiring protective measures and scenic easements along the right-of-ways of interstate and limited-access highways being built.

That this action be encouraged and supported by all garden clubs was resolved by the board of directors of the National Council of State Garden Clubs, Inc. meeting group, also sent letters to Congress in New York City in January. The resolution specifically urged that Congress should be asked to pass legislation restricting advertising along the \$27 billion national super highway network in the interest of safety and beauty.

Acting on the recommendation of the National Council of State Garden Clubs, Inc. the affiliated Federated Garden Clubs of Michigan Inc. has urged all Michigan Garden Clubs in the state organization to send letters to Congress asking that such legislation be passed. The Farmington Garden Club as a body has already taken this action.

Local garden club officials urged that other interested residents, though they may not be presently affiliated with any garden club, also send letters to Congress asking that this legislation be passed. Those writing are asked to direct their letters to Senator Albert J. Isaacs, who is sponsoring legislation to the floor. It is also asked that copies be forwarded to Senator Charles E. Potter and Senator Patrick McNamara. All letters should be addressed to the Senate Office Building, Washington D. C., it was pointed out.

Possible legislation that is being discussed: (1) Would forbid signs within 500 feet of the property line of any right-of-way. (2) Would authorize states and municipalities to supplement the basic prohibitions with more restrictive regulations. (3) Would provide that essential services for users of the highways, such as gas stations and restaurants, be publicly owned or controlled to prevent the mushroom growth of roadside plants.

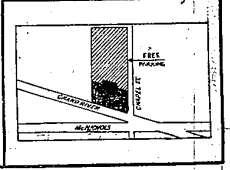
