To Show Movies On Youth Going To Church

Aiming straight at the problem of bringing unchurched youth to Christ, The Concord Publishing Co. and Family Films have collaborated to produce a new movie entitled "This Way to Heaven."

It will be shown on March 27, at the Clarenceville Seventh-day Adventist church, located at Oxford and Grand River, as announced by Pastor Wayne Hyde, at 7:30 p.m.

The choir, under the direction of Mr. Albert Davies, is a source of great pride to the congregation and is making a vital contribution to the service. They are now working on the Easter music.

Family Films has produced the film "The Bible on the Table." This sound film presents the story of the collaboration with the Jam-Handy Studios of Detroit. The film portrays the "3 Ps" of public appearance—personality, preparation and presentation—in a vivid and often humorous manner.

Pastor Grau further states that the fundamental principals of bringing neighborhood youth to Christ are touchingly and dramatically demonstrated in each film, which can be viewed with profit by the public at large as well as youth workers.

The pictures are in black and white and run about 30 minutes each.

Christian Science Topic For Sunday Selected

Man's God-given dominion over the material laws of sickness and death will be emphasized at a Christian Science services Sunday.

Scriptural selections in the Lesson-Sermon will be on "Matter." From "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy the following will be read (380:2-3, 4): "Every law of matter or the body, supposed to govern man, is rendered null and void by the law of Life, God."

The Lesson Text is from Colossians (3:2): "Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth."

Anger and Conceit Kept Many From Believing in Christ

It was both fitting and significant that Jesus should make an announcement of His mission on earth in Nazareth where He had been born and brought up. It was there, after the return from Egypt, that He had "increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man."

There He received the instruction every Jewish child underwent and there He had attended the synagogue. Now He came to His former home to enter specifically the mission which would lead him to the cross. He went to the synagogue on the Sabbath as was His custom.

He was well received and given the book of the prophet Isaiah. But the welcome soon changed as Jesus read from the prophetic words that His hearers understood as pertaining to the Messiah: "The spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to preach good tidings to the poor."

He closed the book and announced to his startled hearers, "Today hath this scripture been fulfilled in your ears."

They marvelled at His eloquence but, in their marveling, did not forget that He was Joseph's son.

Perceiving their thoughts, Jesus reminded them that a prophet was not without honor save in his own country. From Jewish history He related incidents and lessons concerning those who had had prophets in their midst but had refused to recognize them or listen to their messages.

Angered, the Jews took Him with mob violence out of the city and threatened to throw Him from the brow of the high hill on which the city was built. It was not an auspicious beginning.

The common people were not to hear Jesus gladly, but the bitterness of bigotry and prejudice aroused that day in Nazareth grew and intensified on the part of those whose hearts and minds were closed to the new and unfamiliar truth.

The climax came in the opposition that nailed Him to the cross.
