Bible Comment: Comfort We Get In Time of Trial Was Denied Christ
JESUS went into the Garden of Gethsemane to pray as He approached His impending fate. With Him He had taken John, Peter and John, the strong and impulsive disciples who were most capable of trust. He had told them to sit in the garden while He went further on to pray. He told them of His great sorrow and of His impending death, and asked them to remain and watch with Him.

It was the human Christ, craving human sympathy and human companionship in the hour of His great trial. But there was that in His soul which no one could share. So He went forward a little and poured out an agonizing petition that the cup of suffering and final agony might pass from Him.

He came back to His disciples and found them asleep. He said to Peter, "What could ye not watch with Me one hour?" He prayed a second time, returned to the three and again they were sleeping. In His deep loneliness, Christ returned once more to prayer and found that courage and confidence had come back to Him.

There was just a gentle reproach for His disciples now. "Arise, let us be going hence, lest it be at hand that betrayeth Me." Cannot hard-pressed souls take great comfort from natural behold. Often we reproach ourselves that our flesh is weak. We feel our weakness. We are conscious of our great cowardice in a trying period of life. We wonder that we have not the strength of will and the courage to enable us to triumph over every danger, to meet willingly every sacrifice!

Featuring Dr. Benjamin E. Mays as speaker, Franklin Community Church held a special Lenten service on Tuesday, March 26.

Dr. Mays, currently President of Morehouse College of Atlanta, Georgia is one of the leading Negro educators in this country and is frequently included on the list of top ten protestant preachers of America.

Her question will be published and answered in the "Ask Andy" column of The Detroit Free Press this Thursday, March 28.
