An annexation proposal will be placed upon the April bal-lot. The parcel of property to be voted upon is 170 acres located at Nine Mile Road south to Eight Mile Road and east of Farmington Road. It is mostly vacant property and the use intended is Residen-tial, Commercial and Indus-

The City needs Industrial and Commercial property to strengthen its tax base and it is felt that annexation is a is felt that annexation is a step in the right direction. Few large vacant parcels of land are available within the city for the use of manufacturing firms. Annexation is the answer to our problem. The sewage and water lines needed in this area are to be installed by the subdivider of the proposed annexed area reflecting no cost to the city.

We hope you as voters will help us in this step to obtain future industrial and commercial areas.

STREET MAINTENANCE


The Public Works Department is responsible for the care and maintenance of the Streets. They build, repair, grade, salt and clean the roadways.

Pictured below is the project of rebuilding Powers Road from Shiawassee to Ten Mile Road. It was one of the major projects undertaken last year in our street building program. Other areas that have been paved are North Farmington Road, Prospect, Powers, Violet, Lilac and Alta Loma Drive.

Care of our Roadways include:

- 1. 72 miles of snow removal;
- 2. 20,000 lbs. of salt used;
- 3. 27,155 feet of grading;
- 4. 48 ton of patching material;
- 5. 4,550 gallons of oil used for dust control. . "

The Public Works dept. besides providing maintenance of streets: cleans sewers, maintains parks, collects rubbish, cares for trees and parking lot.
