Track Team To Hold First Meet Saturday



Larry Andrews Named To WOCL All-League Team

Larry Andrews, a mainstay and leader on the Trojan basketball team, was honored with a first team berth on the Wayne-Oakland County League All-Conference team by all three Detroit newspapers.

Andrews scored 255 points in 17 games for a 17 point average. Coach Turlo says of Andrews: "He possesses the quickest hands of any player I have coached and has a one-handed flip shot that is almost impossible to defend against. If it weren't for his size, he would easily be one of the top players in the state. His only weakness is guarding in a tight man-for-man pressing defense, but he is only a junior."

15 Killed In Hunting Accidents In State

Fifteen persons were killed and 210 injured in hunting accidents during Michigan's 1956 deer and small game seasons. The death toll was the lowest since 1931.

In comparison with 1955, the fatal accident toll last year was exactly the same—225—but fewer fatalities were recorded in 1956. The 1955 report listed 25 persons killed and 200 injured.

Accident averages during small game seasons showed one fatality for every 138,200 hunters and one wounding per 4457 hunters.
