Plan To Plant Several Trout Eggs In State

LANSING—Plans for the experimental release of 42,000 legal and sub-legal size rainbow and steelhead trout in and near the mouths of a number of northern Michigan streams are now being made in Conservation Department offices.

The plantings, scheduled for May and June, will mark the third year in which rainbow strain trout have been experimentally released near the mouth of Michigan streams.

The Michigan experiment is to determine whether these steelheads, or native wild rainbows, or brook stock rainbows, raised in Michigan hatcheries will take on this rapid growth in the Great Lakes.

If any or all of these fish types show rapid growth and survive, general plantings could be made to provide more Michigan steelhead trout from the state of Washington, where trout thrive in Puget Sound and inland streams. None of the 17,000 surviving eggs have other chemical or combination of been planted in Michigan waters.

Develop New Insect Repellent

A new liquid insect repellent, diethyl toluamide, should soon be on the market, Michigan State University reports.

It can be applied to the skin or clothes to protect against at least five insect pests—mosquitoes, ticks, chiggers, fleas and flies. It is the nearest to an all-purpose repellent yet developed. Other repellents are that it is non-greasy, odorless in consistency, has a delicate fresh fragrance and is resistant to rubbing or wearing off that makes one application last several hours.

Diethyl toluamide was synthesized some years ago by U. S. Department of Agriculture research chemists and then was tested against various annoying or harmful insects at the department's entomology laboratory, Orlando, Florida. The Department of the Army cooperated in the tests because the health of its men in the field includes protection against insect attack.

A total of 50 boys have been practicing baseball for the past two weeks, seeking to land positions on the school's varsity and junior varsity teams.

From the 50, Mr. Warren Piche, varsity baseball coach, has selected 20 players whom he thinks are varsity baseball material. The list of players will soon be cut down to about 15.

Mr. Robert Durech, JV baseball coach, will trim the JV team to 15 players soon.

The practices held thus far have been primarily for conditioning purposes.

Seven varsity lettermen are joining the team again. They are Carl Love, Dave Cathlamet, Larry Lynch, Bob Utley, Tom Grimsaw, Roy Temple, and Jim Hanson. These players will help fill the varsity team, but Farmington still will use many boys from last year's JV team and from among the newcomers.

Some of the boys who have been considered prospects for the varsity are Harvey Chapman, Dan Thompson, Ed Follon, Glen Eley, and Ross Byron.

Farmington's greatest need is for hitters. Hitting was the weak spot in the Falcon team last year, and it will determine how far the Falcons go this year, more than anything else.

The pitching department seems to shape up quite strongly. Carl Love and Roy Temple, both of whom have pitched on the varsity for themselves, should provide pitching power. Both boys have similar pitching backgrounds, but Love has the better record of the two.

Last season the Farmington Varsity baseball team finished in 2nd place in third place with a 9-5 league record, showing a vast improvement over the preceding year. The team was "plagued by three one-run losses in 1955.

The big guns in the Inter-Lakes Conference last season were Waterford and Berkley. This year, however, Berkley will be without

many of their top players, and therefore Waterford looms as possibly the greatest threat to Farmington High.

The Falcon Varsity plays its first game against Clarencville, first game in their own league last year, April 16. The Clarencville game, to be at the Trojans' home grounds, will provide a perfect opportunity for the Falcons to test their wings.

Spieser, Anthony To Meet At Olympia April 5

Chuck Spieser, a Detroit, will risk his prestige as the foremost light heavyweight title contender when he battles key-artist Tony Anthony at the Olympia Stadium Friday, April 5.

This is the big one for both Spieser and Anthony. Anthony is ranked No. 4 among the light heavyweight contenders for ageless Archie Moore's 175-pound title. The winner of the April 5 duel will definitely meet Moore for the title at the Olympia on Friday, June 7.

Many of the first men who went from the college ranks into professional boxing have depended on speed, boxing skill and defensive adroitness. Not Spieser, who is a slugger who likes to trade in fast and fire away. He is primarily a puncher, and he may be the most accomplished in-fighter in the ring today.

Like Spieser, Anthony is known primarily for his readiness to trade wallops at any time. He may not be as damaging a body puncher as Spieser, but he can't be hard enough to put a foe away with a single punch.

Spieser is a devastating two-fisted slugger with a knack for demolishing his most highly rated opponents. He proved that again in his battle with Germany's Willie Hoepner last fall. Hoepner was linked with Spieser at the time as the logical contender for Moore's title.

The tall southpaw was picked by many to upset Spieser, but he never had a chance. Spieser crushed him with a furious second-round barrage, dropping him twice before the bout ended in 2:29 of the second round. He will be out to do the same thing against Anthony, but this time it is a calculated risk. For Anthony has knocked out ambitions of his own, and the weapons to back them up.
