HAVE YOU TRIED ALUMINUM YET?

Hands up—all those who haven't yet discovered all the active, permanent projects you can carry out with easy-to-do-it-vourself aluminum.

I suspect there are a lot of people who are real whitzes at many kinds of woodwork but shudder at the thought of tackling a job involving metal. Aluminum is metal, of course, and it acts like metal, except for two very important distinctions: doesn't rust, and it can be worked just as easily as wood.

So, for further proof, here are a few lipson how to handle aluminum whether you happen to be planning to use it outside, such as for framework of that patio awing, or are outsimplating a few of the endless number of other items that can be made from it.

To cut sheet aluminum, use any household scissors; to cut rod, tubing, angle or bar-stock, use any moderately fine saw-citier an ordinary hand saw or a coping saw. Any wood or auger bit will drill holes in aluminum, but it's best to back up the metal with a piece of scrap wood.

To bond sheet, her or langle aluminium, use a block of wood as a form around which to make the turn. You will get best results if you kep the bending see lightly with a rubber or wooden mallet make the lightly with a rubber of wooden mallet per can be smoothed with a plane or with sand-paper, emery cloth or a planer-jointer.

The best fastenings are aluminum nails, rivets, bolts or ws, since they won't rust.


