(Continued from Page 2B) ing, laundry facilities, and to add to the athletic plant, health center, music and student services buildings. Loans were repaid through the earnings of these facilities. Only classrooms and laboratories will be included in the new program if it receives legislative approval. Student fees will replace "earnings" of the earlier project as security for the loans.

As the bill now stands it applies only to Michigan State. However, if other Michigan universities and colleges desire to use the same financial arrangements, the bill can be amended to include them, Sen. Reed commented.

A MOVE TO PREVENT "Unjust Enrichment" by trading stamp companies was underway in the Michigan senate last week. A bill sponsored by Senators Lewis J. Christman (R-An Arbor) and Harold M. Ryan (D-Detroit) would require that the cash value of unredeemed trading stamps that have been issued more than seven years be paid by the trading stamp companies to the state's general revenue fund.

Legally speaking, this action would place unredeemed trading stamps under Michigan's "escheats law."

Supporters of the bill reason that:

1. The trading stamp companies sell the stamps at assigned value.
  2. Some trading stamps are never redeemed.
  3. The companies have received money for the stamps and they no longer own them.
- Others contend that true owners cannot be determined, the value of the stamps that are not redeemed should be turned over to the state.
- Actual value of unredeemed stamps is a closely guarded secret. Some trading stamp companies say it is very small.
- Others contend that a large proportion of the stamps are never turned in and that the issuing companies are reaping large profits.

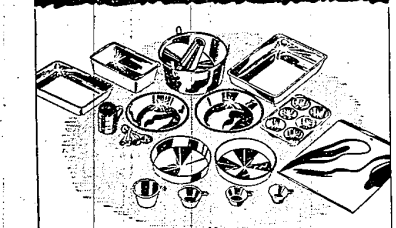
