**Congressman Broomfield Proposes  
Increased Rates For "Junk Mail"**

Taxpayers are footing almost half the bill for "junk mail" which they don't want in the first place, said Congressman William S. Broomfield (R-Royal Oak) said last week.

"Dr. Irving Raines of the postal department told me that the department is spending more than \$200,000,000 a year more than it collects in handling third class mail," said Broomfield. "At a year, the difference was \$200,000,000."

To force direct mail advertisers to pay their own way, Broomfield introduced a spending bill in the House of Representatives that "junk mail" rates be raised to the regular three-cent a letter rate paid by first-class users.

"Even then, the post office department wouldn't be making any money," said Broomfield. "Dr. Raines said it costs the department 2.96 cents to handle a bulk shipment direct mail letter last year."

But the advertiser only pays the government 1.5 cents for the letter, and the rest has to be made up by appropriations to the postal department.

"First class mail is 'losing' money too, said Broomfield. "But at least it is paying a much larger share of its own way than 'junk mail'."

Dr. Raines told Broomfield that the average three-cent letter costs 4.2 cents to handle. "That means the average letter writer is paying three quarters of the cost of transporting and delivering this letter. The 'junk mail' advertiser is getting a free ride for almost half his mailing costs."

"If anybody deserves a break it ought to be the average letter-writing citizen," said Broomfield. "The government has been in effect, subsidizing these direct mail advertisers for years. If they need a subsidy, they ought to go somewhere else for besides the postal department."

Broomfield said he appreciates the problem of the direct mail advertiser. "But this measure, if it is passed, isn't going to put them out of business. It just means they won't be getting a free ride at the expense of the taxpayer any longer."

"My main reason for introducing this bill was to call attention to the fact that direct mail houses are beginning to pay for their own way," said Broomfield. "Maybe first class mail rates would be too high for direct mail advertisers to bear. But their rate ought to be boosted."

**Easter Bunny's  
Origin Explained**

Almost as closely identified with Easter as the chocolate egg, is the bunny.

In Detroit thousands are made in a variety of chocolate, with creamy fillings or just hollow. From miniature to life size, they leave Fred Sanders O.A.K.m.n Blvd. plant to be sold over the counters of their 76 retail stores and market departments.

The Easter bunny's origin goes back to the time when Easter had no religious significance.

In England during the time of pagan Saxons, celebrations were held in the Spring of the year, to honor the goddess Eostre. According to legend, Eostre had a pet rabbit which she changed into a rabbit, the rabbit continued to build its nest in the shape of a bird. The nest was filled with eggs, which even then were part of Easter's festivities. This is how the rabbit and eggs became representative of fertility, that is new life.

Very much later when Easter became a Christian celebration as we know it today, the Easter bunny and of course the eggs became an accepted part of traditional Easter fare.

**State Traffic Deaths Reported Down**

On the basis of provisional figures, traffic deaths in Michigan in March were 21 fewer than in the same month last year.

According to State Police reports, there were 112 persons killed as compared with 133 in March of the previous year.

For the first two months of the year 84 lives were saved as compared with the same period in 1956. This added to the March saving is a total of 105. The figure will be readjusted downward somewhat with the receipt of delayed reports.

The State Police monthly statistical report reveals that for the first time in five years Michigan traffic deaths fell below the 100 mark for any one month with 93 fatalities being recorded in February.

The previous low was in April, 1952, with 94 deaths.

There were 4,037 persons injured and 15,940 reported accidents.

Deaths were 32 per cent, or 60, below the number killed in February last year. Injuries were down 287, or seven per cent, and reported accidents dropped 1,574, or nine per cent.

Figures on accidents and injuries for March will not be available until later this month.

Estimated vehicle mileage for January, the latest figure reported, was 2.4 billion, a nine per cent increase over the same month a year ago.
