Horse Races Open Tonight, April 18, At Northville

Tonight, April 18, will be opening night at Northville Downs Raceway.

General Manager John J. Carlo indicated that there will be approximately 800 horses on the grounds when the starter sends off the first race for the earliest meeting in Michigan history.

It will be the only Michigan racing unit runners open at Hazel Park on May 24. Northville, which races 28 nights through June 1, finds itself without competition except for its final week.

Approximately 200 horses have wintered and put in early training at Northville, Carlo said.

Racing Secretary Bill Connors foresees one of Northville's best seasons with any kind of a break in the weather. He reports an influx of at least 50 new Canadian horses which are expected to give Michigan horses and other regulars top competition.

Connors is returning to the Northville scene after an absence of four years. He succeeded Harry Flinch who made commitments on the west coast before the early Northville dates were announced.

The Northville meeting also will bring John Ducharme back to the Michigan scene. The presiding judge at Wolverine Raceway last year, he replaces the veteran Malcolm Linehan of Adrian as steward. Linehan resigned in September when he and his brother, Albert Jr., purchased a small partnership in Northville Downs.

Ducharme will represent the State at all of Michigan's parimutuel harness racing meetings.

Because Good Friday comes on April 19, Northville Downs actually will begin its 14th season on Tuesday. After opening Thursday night, General Manager Carlo will close the track the next night on Good Friday and re-open on Saturday, April 20.

Expect Record Number Of Trout Anglers In State

Michigan's general trout season, slated to open April 27, will attract more than 235,000 anglers to the thousands of miles of available trout streams and lakes.

Last year, a record 233,000 fishermen purchased trout stamps. This year, another new record will probably be set, it was indicated.

To meet the needs of these fishermen, Michigan's Conservation Department annually plants more than 1,000,000 legal trout.

Some outdoorsmen recall the days of more natural conditions and look on "artificial" trout fishing with dismay. They complain that "put and take" angling reduces enjoyment, muffles enthusiasm, and muddies the aesthetics of a highly colorful sport.

Yet our human population mounts higher and higher each year. Michigan's population has nearly doubled in thirty years, and probably will continue this rapid increase.

And this increasing population includes more and more persons who find time for angling. Shorter work weeks provide more and more leisure. Better transportation helps fishermen get to northern streams and lakes.

And Michigan trout waters, faced with advancing civilization and industrial development, cannot be expected to produce more and more fish to keep ahead of this growing community.

To help natural production and meet the growing demand for trout fishing, the Department makes these annual stockings of brook, brown and rainbow trout.

Let us hope, however, that the day when no wilderness areas or wild trout remain in Michigan is far off, and that the angling pursuit will long remain in our outdoor scene.

Vast Salt Mines Located Under Detroit

Michigan, the nation's leading salt producer, also boasts one of the largest single salt mines in the world—beneath the city of Detroit. From a maze of tunnels and caverns more than 100 feet below the city comes one-fourth of the state's salt production. A number of brine wells in other parts of the state account for the remaining 3/4; is processed and stockpiled.

Detroit's subterranean mine has been in operation since 1910 and is the only one of its type in Michigan.

In the Detroit mine, salt is blasted loose and the lumps are hauled to underground crushers where it is processed and stockpiled.
