State Adoption Exchanges Start

Six states have now established official clearing houses to facilitate adoption of children for whom it is difficult to find homes, and nine more are considering establishing them, the Child Welfare League of America, a Michigan United Fund agency, reported recently.

Despite the fact that there are 800,000 couples annually applying to adopt only 80,000 available children, the League reported that it is still extremely difficult to find adoptive homes for certain categories of children legally available. The main categories are: (1) Children over six years of age. (2) Children with physical handicaps. (3) Children of mixed racial backgrounds. (4) Children from minority racial groups. (5) Children who should be placed in a different geographical area. (6) Family groups.

The clearing houses are called "adoption resource exchanges." They are simply central offices through which public and private adoption agencies may exchange information about children for whom no homes can be found and prospective adoptive parents who would be interested in these children.

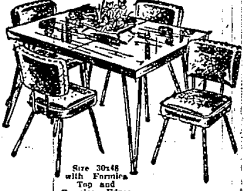
