Sealed bids for the purchase of tax anticipation notes of Farmington Public School District, Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, of the par value of \$100,000.00 will be received by the undersigned at the Board of Education Office, 33000 Thomas, Farmington, Michigan, until 8:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on the 10th day of June, 1957, at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read.

The notes will be dated June 1, 1957, will mature March 1, 1958, and will bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding 4 1/2% per annum. Both principal and interest will be payable at the National Bank of Detroit, Farmington Branch. Denominations and form of notes to be at the option of the purchaser. Accrued interest to date of delivery of such notes must be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

For the purpose of awarding the notes the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the notes from July 1st (Here insert the first day of the month next following the date of receiving bids or the date of the notes, whichever is later) to their maturity and deducting therefrom any premium. 
Now in her leisure time she sews and paints. Her paintings are hung throughout the house and add much to the decor of their modern furnishings.
