

Complete Plans For North Farmington Little League Program, Funds Needed

Plans are now being completed for the official opening of the newly organized North Farmington Little League summer baseball program. League officials disclosed last week.

Work on the playing field is almost completed, they indicated, and a pop stand from which to serve refreshments has been obtained. An opening day ceremony at which is now being planned in the field all boys participating in

the baseball program will take part.

The League is providing all boys living in the area north of Elmwood Road between 8 and 12 years of age with a chance to learn baseball under capable adult supervision. While teaching boys the rudiments of the game, officials of the league said, we have uppermost in our minds the responsibility of instilling in the boys the spirit of team play, obedience to rules, good sportsmanship and respect for the rights of others.

Some funds have already been donated to the League by six public spirited sponsors, but considerably more is needed in this first year of operation to get the program off to a good start, officials commented.
