## Church Educator To Speak June 23

Known as a national authority on Christian education, the Reverend Harold E. Garner, faculty member at Moody Bible Institute, Chicago, will speak at the First Baptist Church of Farmington, Sunday, June 23, at 9:30 a.m. and again at 11:45 a.m.

Mr. Garner, whose numerous engagements as a convention speaker take him to dozens of cities each year, served for five years as field secretary for the Evangelical Teacher Training Association.

Born at St. Catharines, Ontario, Mr. Garner was educated at the University of Toronto in Canada and the Moody Bible Institute, a school for training young men and women as pastors, missionaries and Christian workers; and Wheaton College, Wheaton, Illinois.

Mr. Garner held pastorates in Illinois and Indiana for a number of years before he directed his classes toward the teaching of Christian education and joined the Moody staff in 1936.

Mr. and Mrs. Garner, who often work as a team, are popular speakers at Christian education conventions and are kept busy conducting teacher training classes in addition to their work at the institute.
