Al's Muscle Beach has boats, bait, refreshments, good parking, fine fishing and a hospitable, healthy atmosphere.

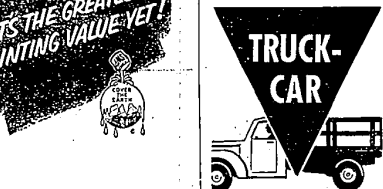
Off on a four day fishing trip is Arthur Conklin, Jr.
