Traffic Deaths In May Reduced

Traffic deaths in Michigan in May were 10 less than in the same month a year ago, marking the fifth consecutive month this year in which there has been a reduction, according to State Police provisional figures.

visional figures.

Getting off to a poor start during which deaths were higher, May slowly began to hich shead on the safety side and ended with a total of 128 killed as compared with 133 in the same month last year, a saving of eight per cent.

Final figures for April also were released, showing 111 persons killed and 4,389 injured in 13,943 accidents. Deaths decreased 21 per cidents.

ed and 4,389 injured in 13,943 ecidents. Deaths decreased 21 per cent; or, 22 under 140 in the same month of 1985. Injuries increased four per cent over 4,224 and accidents were reduced one per cent under 14,021.

For the first five months this year '564 persons have been killed compared with 707 for the same period in 1956, a reduction of 148 or 20 per cent.
