layed either until proletarian revolution rips in Europe or until colonial revolutions come fully to a head, or finally until the capitalists fight among themselves. Therefore, the maintenance of peaceful relations with capitalist countries (Ed: until the time is ripe) is an obligatory task for us. The basis of our relations with the capitalist countries consists in admitting the co-existence of two opposed systems.

(This says clearly that the strategy is to delay the inevitable war until all the advantages are on the side of the Communists.)

"Peace" A Deception

LENIN: "If war is waged by the exploiting class with the object of strengthening its class rule, such a war is a criminal war, and 'defensiveness' in such a war is a base betrayal of Socialism. If war is waged by the proletariat after it has conquered the bourgeoisie in its own country, and is waged with the object of strengthening and extending Socialism, such a war is legitimate and 'holy'."

LENIN: "Every 'peace program' is a deception of the people and a piece of hypocrisy unless its principal object is to exploit the masses the need for a revolution, and to support, aid and develop the revolutionary struggle of the masses."

Meaning of "Peace"

LENIN: "There is a glaring contradiction between the imperialists' policy of piling up armaments and their hypocritical talk about peace. There is no such contradiction, however, between the Soviet government's preparations for defense and for revolutionary war and a consistent peace policy. Revolutionary war of the proletarian dictatorship is but a continuation of revolutionary peace policy by other means."

Our Government should enter into no agreements on disarmament with the Soviet Communist government until its leaders one by one have announced to the world a renunciation of Leninism and have shown concrete evidence of their truthfulness. This could happen, but I wouldn't advise anyone in the State Department to hold his breath until it does!
