United Lutheran Parish Being Organized in North Farmington

The Board of American Missions of the United Lutheran Church in America disclosed last week that it has sent the Reverend James E. Henneberger to organize a new Lutheran congregation in the Farmington area.

A survey conducted last summer between Twelve and Fourteen Mile Road from Farmington Road to Middlebelt Road revealed that many families living in this area were interested in seeing a new United Lutheran congregation organized. The increasing number of new homes being built in this area also verifies the great need for another church to serve this rapidly expanding community, officials indicated.

The United Lutheran Church in America (U.L.C.A.) represented by Pastor Henneberger, is the largest of all Lutheran bodies in North America, and it has affiliated churches (mission fields) in three other continents: Africa, Asia, and South America. The U.L.C.A. supports four colleges and ten theological seminaries in the United States and Canada.

Pastor Henneberger, who participated actively in the World Council of Churches, the Lutheran World Federation, the National Council of Churches in the U.S.A., and in the National Lutheran Council. The National Lutheran Council is a cooperating organization, composing two-thirds of all Lutheran bodies in America, and it is through the National Lutheran Council that the Farmington area has been assigned to the United States.

North Farmington Baptist Church Officially Set Up

The members of the North Farmington Baptist Church and the Mission Church Committee of the Covenant Baptist Church of Detroit met for a banquet in the fellowship hall of the Covenant Church, Friday, June 14.

The purpose of the occasion was the signing of a Charter, the adoption of a permanent constitution, the election of permanent officers and the adoption of a resolution to incorporate.

Dr. Warner R. Cole, pastor of the parent church, gave an inspirational challenge to the new church which is 17 months old and numbers 20 families.

They are meeting temporarily in Bond Grade School, located on the Northwest corner of 13 Mile Road and Orchard Lake Road. Future plans call for the erection of a church home on a 6 1/2 acre plot across from Westbrook Manor subdivision, one-half mile west of the school.

The pastor, the Reverend Melvin R. Walter, pointed out to the group that they had arrived at this important step in the life of the new church because of togetherness and the combined efforts of many interested persons.

He related that the church was born out of the Missionary interest of a great fellowship of churches, the American Baptist Convention, the Detroit Association and the pastor and members of the Covenant Baptist Church.

The Charter was signed by 61 persons, 18 of whom were baptized by the pastor since the work began.

The evening was concluded by a closing prayer from the President of the Detroit Association, Royden Behmer.

Arab Information Center Head Explains Islam Religion; History

An interesting and enlightening talk was given at the Farmington Universalist Church recently by Mr. Sahwell, acting director of the Arab Information Center of Chicago, explained the Islam Religion, giving some of its history, its basic concepts and the areas of the world where it is followed, and is of the Christian faith.

Mr. Sahwell was born in Jordan and attended a Quaker High School just outside Jerusalem and then took his bachelor's degree in Law from Harvard and is now working on a PhD. degree in Jurisprudence at Columbia.

According to Mr. Sahwell, there are altogether between 350 and 400 million followers of the Islam religion in the world today. Islam is the religion of most of the Arab peoples, though some Arabs follow the Jewish faith and some are Christians. Islam is the religion of many people in Asia, and there are approximately 30 million in Russia.

Mecca is the shrine of the Islam religion because it was near there that Mohammed was born. Mohammed began to teach the people of his area. To some, he was a wise prophet, but he was persecuted by others. He was exiled from his birthplace for a period of twelve years. He continued to win followers and eventually returned to Mecca. After his death at the age of 58 his followers continued to teach the Koran and the religion spread eastward.

The Judean religion as set forth in the "Old Testament" as well as the teachings of Jesus had a great influence on Mohammed. Many of the events are repeated in the Koran.

The difference between Islam and Mohammedanism is that the Mohammedans deny Mohammed, but the Islam, Mohammed, as well as the teachings of Jesus had a great influence on Mohammed. "Actually, the Islam," stated M.R. Sahwell, "worship the same God as the Christians. Islam means, Surrender to God."

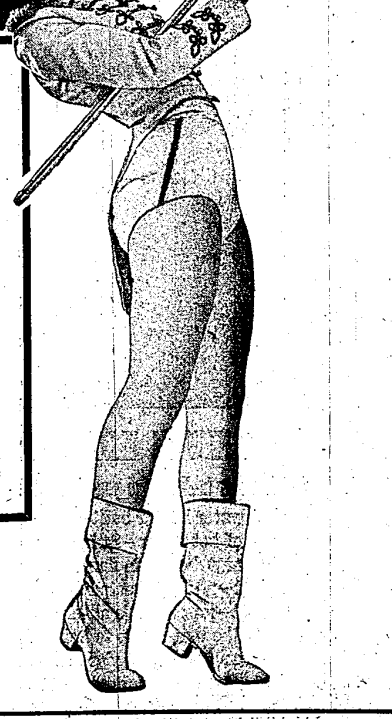
