Mrs. Martha J. McLaughlin, 18501 Foch, Livonia, passed away suddenly, July 7, from a heart condition at her residence.

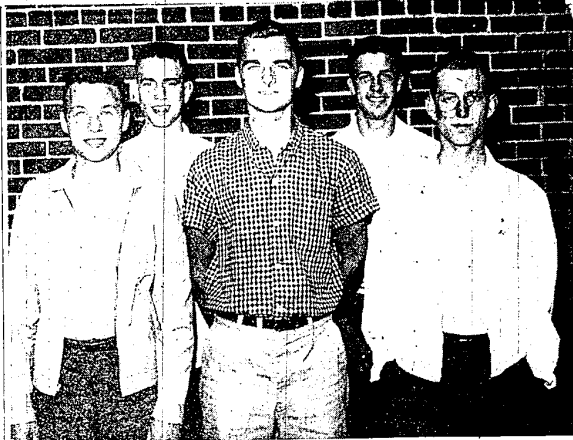
