

Musicians Visit Farmington GC Student Is At Disneyland

One of Europe's outstanding youth music organizations, the 76-piece Leeds (England) Youth Orchestra, will make a five-day visit to the Farmington July 23-28. The group will present two concerts.

The first will be at 8 p.m., Wednesday, July 25, in the auditorium of Harrison High School, 2995 12 Mile Road, Farmington.

The second will be at 6:30 p.m., Friday, July 27, in the Farmington Downtown Shopping Center, Grand River and Farmington Roads. It will be a feature of the Farmington Founders Festival.

Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp, through its international exchange program, is the host sponsor for the orchestra's tour.

An 84-member Blue Lake International Band is now

making a 30-day tour of the Netherlands, Belgium, Germany and Denmark.

Farmington is the first stop for the Leeds Orchestra in its three-week tour of Michigan. Its itinerary also includes Roscommon, Grand Rapids, Muskegon, and the Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp, near Whitehall.

The Farmington Community Center is sponsoring the visit, and Dick Pryor, 2950 Gilchrist, Farmington, is chairman of the host committee.

Music booster clubs from the three Farmington high schools are assisting with arrangements. Host committee members include Al Benden and Barbara Hughes of North Farmington High School; Harry Williams and Robert Kelly of Farmington High School; and Mary Murphy and Pryor from Harrison High School.

The Leeds Orchestra and 11 staff members will arrive in Detroit from England at 6 p.m., Monday, July 23. They will then take buses to the Farmington Community Center where they will meet their host families. Two are assigned to each home. Host families will house, feed and entertain the visitors, and take them on tours in the Detroit area.

The orchestra members

are between the ages of 13 and 18 for the most part, but a few up to 25 continue to play with the group.

The orchestra was organized in 1965 by its present conductor, Bernard Armour, a woodwind teacher.

The group's sponsor is the 150-member Friends of the City of Leeds Youth Orchestra. Each student is paying \$200 to make the trip. The balance of the cost was raised through concerts and fund raising projects during the past two years.

The repertoire for the tour includes Schubert's Symphony No. 5, Mendelssohn's "Merry Wives," "Festival" and "Magic Flute" overtures; "Divertissement" by Ibert; "John Henry" and "Quiet City" by Copland; "Festini" by Jacov; "English Dances" and some 30 other selections.

Nine groups from Europe will visit Michigan this summer under the auspices of Blue Lake. Most will participate in the First Annual International Music Festival in Muskegon this summer.

Coming from West Germany will be the 33-member Jugendorchester (chamber orchestra) from Ahrensburg, and the 85-member Chor der Jennesses Musicales (choir and small orchestra) from Bremen.

From the Netherlands will come the 60-member Kinderkor (elementary choir) from Epen, two baseball teams from Bussum, and the 49-member adult Hilversum Police Band.

The Sing and Be Happy Choir will be in Birmingham in our Shepherd Lutheran Church for a concert July 29.

The St. James Choir and Orchestra will be in Bloomfield Hills Aug. 9.
